Overview & Purpose

- The purpose of this plan is to provide answers and expectations during our time of distance learning.
- Serve families by providing meaningful instruction to students until the end of the year (May 8th, 2020).

Providing Technology to Students

Chromebooks will be checked out to parents of students who need a device through curbside pick-up at their school. Please stay in your vehicle, and a school employee will meet you in front of their building; retrieving the necessary items. We ask parents and students to please take good care of the Chromebooks. Replacement cost for each device is \$200.

Internet and Devices

If you have a device (Computer, I-pad, some cell phones, etc.) they can access the internet from home. If you have one of these devices, please do not check anything out from your school.

Hotspots for Internet Connection

Most smartphones can be used as a hotspot to provide internet capabilities for devices. Many companies are offering free and reduced cost internet for individuals. We are also in the process of ordering additional hotspots. Due to the high demand of these devices, they are scheduled to arrive in 2-3 weeks. We will call families if/when available.

Returning Textbooks/library books/calculators, etc.

If your child has a textbook(s) or library book(s) that need to be returned, these will be accepted at the drive thru on the designated day listed above. Textbooks and library books left in lockers will be automatically checked back in for your child.

Personal Belongings

All belongings have been bagged and labeled with student's names. They are stored in a safe location. If you need to pick up your child's belongings, the times are listed above.

If parents cannot make these times and dates, please email your child's principal. They will schedule an appointment to pick items up and checkout devices. You may also call your child's school and leave a message.

Site principals will contact families who fail to pick up devices, packets, or belongings to arrange for delivery or pick up on an as-needed basis.

INSTRUCTIONAL GUIDANCE

Methodology:

- Teachers will provide Online Instruction and Home Based Learning Packets as needed.
- Students will complete assignments given by their teachers through paper packets, digital learning, or a blend of both.
- **Students should expect to participate in learning for suggested time frames per grade level:**

➤ PK: 30 minutes daily
➤ K-1st: 45 minutes daily
➤ 2nd-3rd: 60 minutes daily
➤ 4th-5th: 90 minutes daily
➤ 6th-12th: 30-45 minutes per teacher for a maximum of 3 hours per day

- School site faculty meetings will take place via Zoom as needed to plan, organize, and collaborate.
- Grade-level and subject-area meetings will be scheduled on Zoom as needed.
- Grade levels will collaborate on standards/concepts to ensure equity across the district.
- Specials & Elective teachers will provide weekly activities or resources for students through social media, Google Classroom, or other means of communication.
- Parent/Student information will be provided via Marietta District School Website, Facebook (Live Feed), Twitter, or Robo-call.

SPED/504/ELL SERVICES:

- Individualized Education Plans (IEP), 504s, English Language Academic Plans (ELAP) will be followed to the greatest extent possible.
- IEP and 504 meetings will be held through phone or video conference according to the current timeline unless an in-person meeting is requested by the parent via letter, email, text, or other form of communication.

Distance Learning Plan Per School Building

PRIMARY SCHOOL

Pre-K:

- Pre-K Teachers are all continuing to use their Bloomz/Dojo apps and their classroom Facebook groups to communicate with parents. They plan to utilize their ABC countdown curriculum. Next week is A-E. Each day they will post a fun activity to go with the letter and supplement them with some kind of reading or math activity. They will have a weekly science lesson as well. Starting the week after next, they will also utilize virtual field trips such as OKC zoo videos as well as class shirt Fridays. They will be sharing links, such as OETA TV, ABC Mouse, Get Epic Books, StarFall, and Mystery Science. They will also post videos of themselves reading books, explaining letter of day activities, showing them math games, etc.
- They have made packets for students without the internet. The packets include manipulatives, dry erase paper, handwriting papers, crayons, scissors, glue, play dough. They are also including their Handwriting Without Tears workbooks as well as their poetry books.

KINDERGARTEN:

- Kindergarten Teachers have created classroom Facebook groups and will use this to communicate with parents and students as well as their Bloomz and text apps. They will post videos to show classroom routines...dry erase board activities, packet pages, Phonics activities, etc. They will ask for pics/ videos of students for a check in of their work. They have links for independent readers, phonemic awareness videos, and math programs.

They are also using the online programs Epic and Happy Numbers. They will also send home morning work packets for daily math and reading review as well as ReadWell (their reading curriculum) workbooks. They will post videos/pictures of ReadWell small group readers as well as assign certain workbook pages through the Facebook groups.

- For students without the internet, they are sending home packets that include their classroom workbooks, worksheets, dry erase boards and dry erase markers, reading magazines, weekly readers for science/social studies, and school supplies.

FIRST GRADE:

- First Grade Teachers have created classroom Facebook groups and will use these and their Remind app to stay connected with students and their families. They will be using MobyMax, Epic, Ticket to Read, and Xtra math for online lessons. They are sending a parent letter with students on Friday when they pick up belongings/devices on how to access the lessons as well as post to the Facebook page.
- For students without internet access (and all of their students), they are sending packets which will include supply bags, daily journals, and a science activity (seedling to plant/watch grow).

SECOND GRADE:

- Second Grade Teachers have created classroom Facebook groups as well as use their Remind apps to communicate with parents and students. They are using Study Island, Epic Reading, Ticket to Read, Reflex Math, Moby Max and Khan Academy. They will post assignments through their Facebook groups.
- For students without the internet, they are making paper packets that include ReadWell paper reader stories, reading passages for fluency practice, sight words, math facts, and addition & subtraction regrouping worksheets.

SPED:

- The SPED Teacher is doing the IXL program for her ID students, and they will have Ed Mark reading curriculum packets to work on. For her other students with an IEP, she will be calling them weekly to see if they need help with any of the distance learning sites for their class. She is also sending OT workbooks home for her students who receive OT. She will send out progress reports to all of her students with an IEP on Wednesday. She will continue to hold phone IEP meetings as necessary. She is also collaborating with teachers as necessary for her students with an IEP.

ELL:

- The ELL Teacher is posting links and websites to Facebook and sharing resources with teachers. She is helping teachers post ideas in their Facebook group as well as helping teachers make Facebook groups. She is also supporting teachers by communicating with parents as necessary and

having our ELL assistant help translate for Spanish speaking families in notes, posts, and phone calls.

SPECIALS:

- These Teachers have created a Specials Facebook group where they are all posting music, art, physical activities ideas and links and asking parents and students to interact with them on the Facebook group.

COUNSELING:

- The Counselor is posting a weekly video of herself (on the Elementary Specials Facebook page) discussing different topics-coping skills, deep breathing techniques, how to help with anxiety or fears, etc. Most of our teachers are sharing her videos on their own classroom Facebook groups.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

3rd-5th Grade teachers will use Google Classroom for distance learning.

- **Students without the internet** will receive a Career Project Packet. The project will include various careers that may be of interest to them. The project allows them to interview (in a coronavirus-friendly way), build a resume, plan a career, along with other fun items. Teachers will follow up with their students in May. A variety of questions will be asked over the packet to analyze what students 'learned'. There will also be a review of math standards.
- **Students with internet and Chrome Books (or other devices)** will learn through a Google Classroom platform. Each grade level has created a Google classroom and all work will be posted on this platform. Students, please check your Teacher's Google Classroom daily.
- **ELL, SPED, and Specials Teachers** will post helpful links on the Teachers Google Classroom for students to access.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

6th- 8th Grade teachers will use Google Classroom for distance learning.

- All teachers will post assignments on the Google Classroom platform.
- Teacher’s Office hours will be included with your child’s first assignment.
- Assignments will be posted on Google Classroom on Monday. All assignments will be due on Thursday of the same week.
- Teachers will be specific with the links and sites they are using when they communicate with your child on April 6th.
- Teachers will provide subject specific tools.
- Teachers will provide direct links of tools to be used in student assignments.
- Teachers will use Google-friendly tools that make sign-in convenient for students

Students, please make sure you are checking your Teachers Google Classroom every Monday for lessons, materials, and instructions.
