

# Smith, Yosten named in unoffical results

Unofficial results of the midterm general election were released by Pierce County Clerk Shannon Wragge around 10 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 6.

In the only truly contested race in Plainview, the City Council contest - the three candidates were sorted at the close of the election as:

Bob Smith: 269  
Pam Yosten: 259  
Trisha Flesner: 201

As there were only two seats available, Smith and Yosten were (unofficially, so far), elected to the Council positions and will take their seats in coming months.

Idates that had filed for the seats by the deadline.

In Antelope County, Frahm won 121 more votes, Rasmussen had 109 and Thor had 79 additional.

In Knox County, Frahm won five votes, Rasmussen had five votes and Thor had three votes.

Frahm, Rasmussen and Thor will take their seats on the board in the coming months.

# Plainview Arts Council season starts Nov. 18



The 2018-2019 Plainview Arts Council Season kicks off on Sunday, Nov. 18 at 2 p.m. with the Wayne State College Chamber Ensemble and Big Band in the Pirate Auditorium at Plainview Public Schools.

The Wayne State College Choirs include a 60 voice Concert Choir, 24 voice Women's Choir, and a select 12 voice chamber ensemble. The large ensemble performs a wide variety of literature including major works and staples of the choral repertoire. The smaller ensembles perform music ranging from traditional madrigals and motets to music theater and vocal jazz. Each year, choral ensembles present several "Evening of Choirs" concerts, annual Madrigal dinners, tours to area schools, and are featured at the holiday gala.

Directed by Matthew Armstrong and accompanied by Shelly Armstrong, the WSC choral program consists of students representing many majors and disciplines.

The Wildcat Big Band is a traditional large jazz ensemble made up of students at Wayne State College in Wayne, Nebraska. Directed by Dr. Josh Calkin, the group performs big band music ranging from traditional swing and 1960s bebop and fusion to modern jazz and transcriptions. The group performs several times a year at events including concerts, dances, fundraisers, holiday gala events and more.

# School still taking piano donations

329 votes.  
Write-in votes had 19, but no candidates were official.

#### Countywide Results

A 57 percent turnout was counted by the Pierce County Clerk of voters in the election.

Pierce County voters elected Deb Fischer for a second term at the U.S. Senate. Statewide results were the same, electing Fischer over Jane Raybould (D), and Jim Schultz (I).

Adrian Smith (R) won his seventh-term by a landslide vote in Pierce County. Smith outpaced Paul Theobald, 76 percent to 23 percent.

Governor Pete Ricketts and Mike Foley won a second term at the State's highest position. Ricketts/Foley also won the state nod, by near 20 points.

Secretary of State Bob Evnen took Pierce County's vote. Evnen also took the state nod over Spencer Danner.

Charlie Janssen was re-elected to the State Auditor role for another term by Pierce County voters. Statewide Janssen won over Jane Skinner (D) 57 to 42 percent.

Pierce County Voters denied the Initiative 427 Medicare Expansion vote by a tally of 1,684 against to 921 for. Statewide voters, in unofficial numbers, passed Initiative 427 for the expansion 53 percent to 46 percent.

#### Local Elections

The Nebraska Legislative Race between Tim Gragert and Keith Kube in District 40 to the north of Plainview was decided late Tuesday with Gragert ending up about 450 votes ahead of Kube for the Legislative seat.

Tim Gragert posted 7,181, or 51.59 percent of the vote. Kube had 6,738 or 48.46 percent of the overall vote.

Those totals were with one precinct in Holt County yet to report. Antelope County Commissioner for District 1 was won by Dean Smith, ousting long-time incumbent Jerald Schwager by a 74 to 25 percent margin.

Smith had 349 votes and Schwager posted 121.

The Antelope County Ag Society vote went "For" with 1,199 votes in favor and 1,104 votes against.

Brunswick's Village Trustees were Craig A. Forbes with 45 votes, and Lynn Pellatz with 20, and a write-in candidate(s) receiving 28. The determination is unsure by the News at press time.

Antelope County Voters moved against Initiative 427 by a commanding 1,491 votes against and 867 for the Medicare expansion.

In junior high, we want all kids to try everything they can. School years are the only opportunity in their entire lives for practically all kids to play competitive team sports.

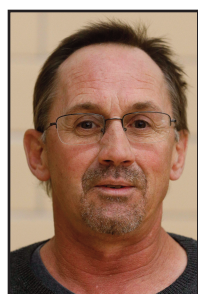
I started my first year here encouraging kids to "buy a ticket." This sentiment still applies.

The Darling Wife loved that dining room table.

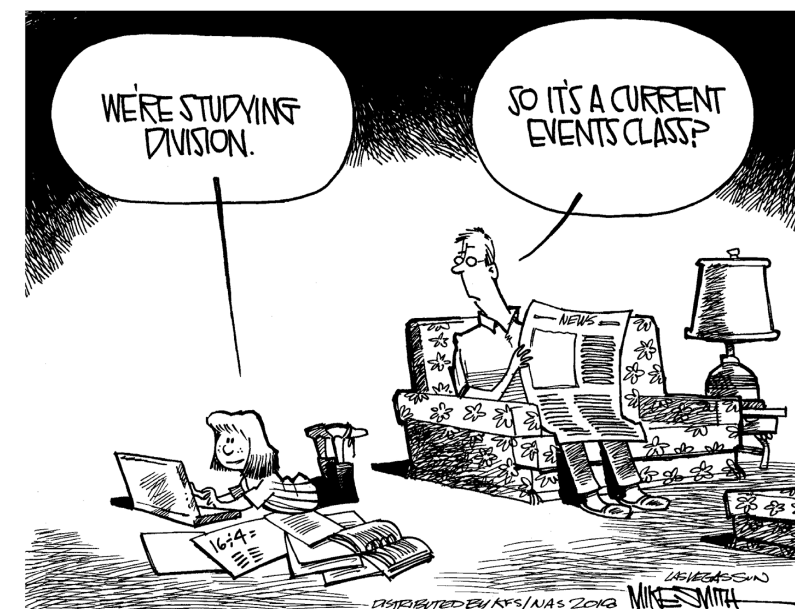
As we hit the HARD wood floor in the dining room, the top of the table fell on top of us.

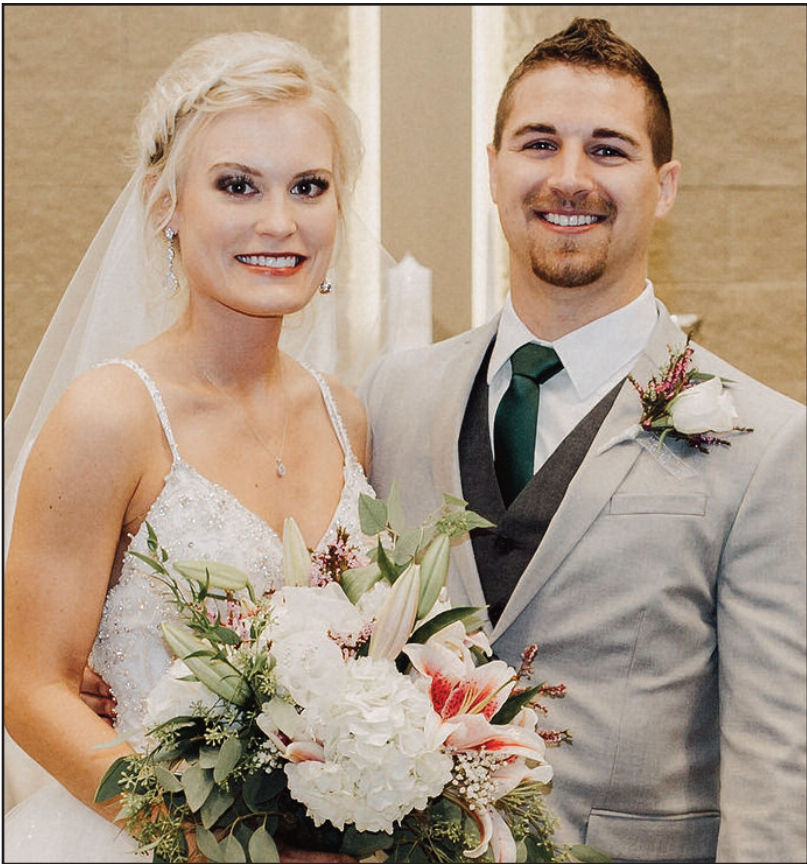

Duane Edward Rasmussen, son of Rasmus and Clara (Petersen) Rasmussen, was born November 22, 1924 at home in rural Plainview, and he died on October 30, 2018 at Norfolk.

He was his parents' only child, and 74 years of his life were lived in the family home.

Rasmussen was baptized and confirmed at Bethany Lutheran Church, west of Plainview. He graduated from District 50 rural school in Antelope County, and then graduated from Plainview High School in 1941.

He farmed, raising crops and livestock, six miles west and one north of Plainview into his mid-80s except for a period of military service as radioman 3rd Class for the U.S. Navy from 1944-1946.

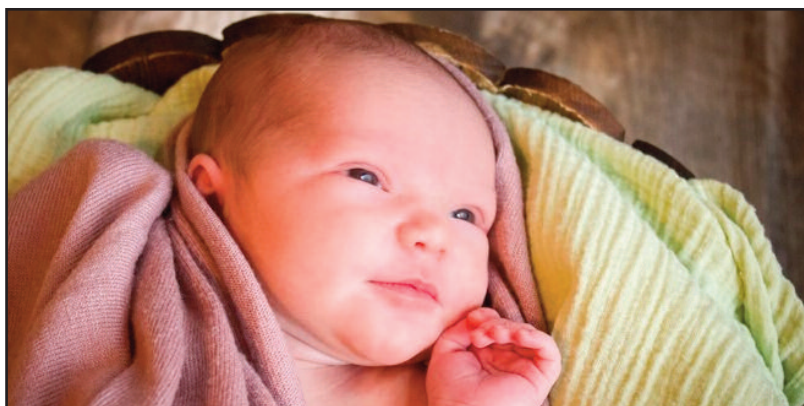

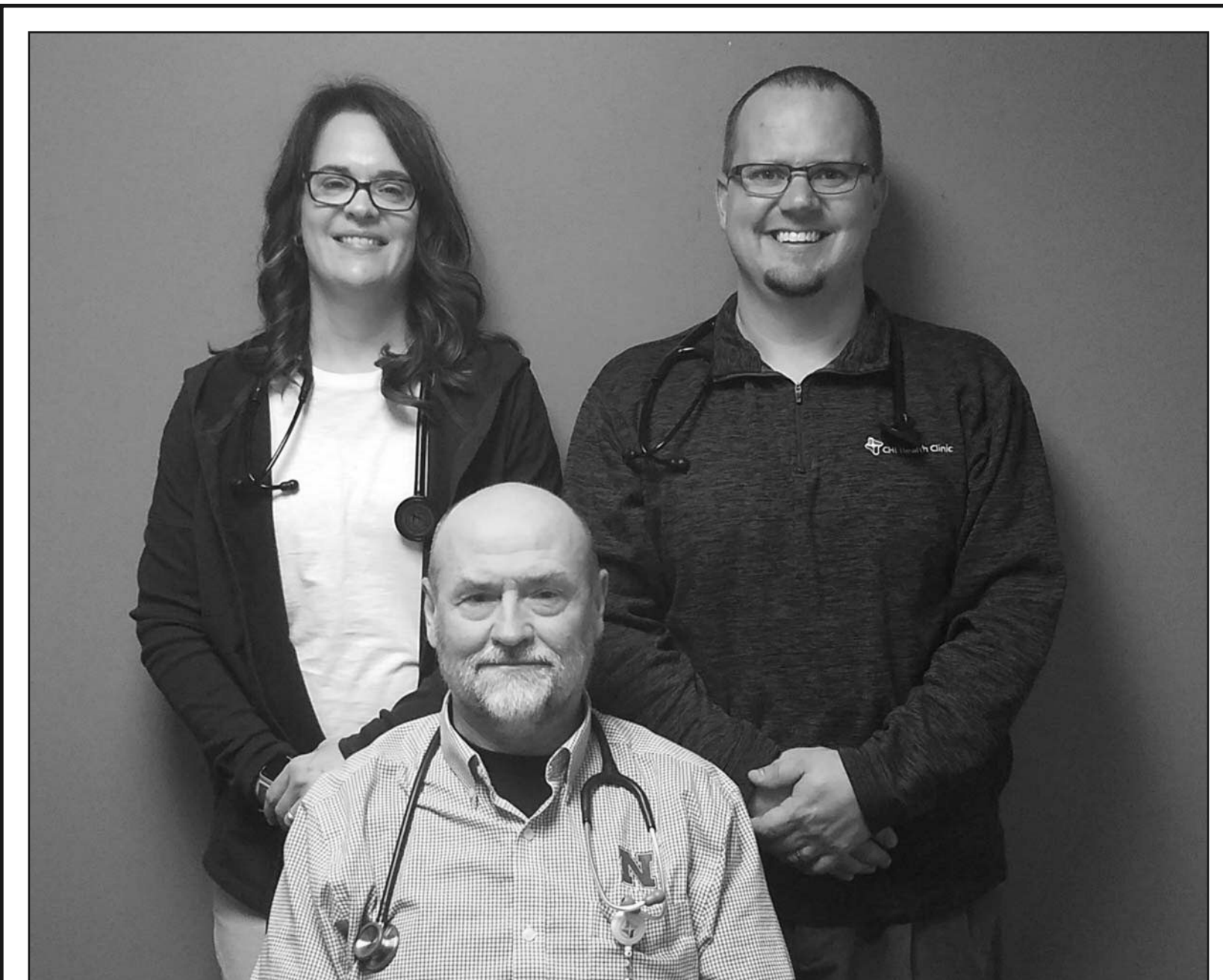

Plainview and the nation went to the polls yesterday in the 1968 general election — and the results of the vote at the polls are still being counted and in some instances won't be known for some days.

For President of the United States, at 8 a.m. Wednesday morning it looked like Republican Richard M. Nixon probably won the election. He had nearly enough electoral college votes credited to him and was leading in other states that would provide the needed numbers — unless there should be a reversal in late returns in some precincts. His popular vote margin was small.

On the local level, it looked like Henry Purdie, Plainview, had unseated Henry Hoftart, Democrat, for the position of County Commissioner of the First District. Hoftart had held the position for the past 24 years.

Vote totals gave Purdie, the Republican, 643 votes to Hoftart's 602 votes. There was a total of 118 absentee votes in the county, however the county clerk's office estimated that there were only 38 absentee votes in the precincts involved by the first commissioner district.

For county judge, Milton Rosenkott, Pierce, who had been an employee of the county judge's office for 12 years, won the nomination for that position over Warren Millnitz of Plainview with a 1839-1231 vote.

The 118 absentee votes could make a change in the race for Pierce County Weed Control Authority. With three to be elected, Robert Craft led with 1952, Leonard Robinson with 1927, Carl Jensen with 1733 and Glenn F. Uecker with 1686. Craft and Robinson could be designated as winners. The absentee votes could change the selection of the third candidate.

For the Soil and Water Conservation District, with two to be elected, Erwin Hilkemann and Andrew Polt appeared to be the winners with sufficient margins.

Pierce county voters, for the second time, said no to a proposed retirement system for county employees.

Robert V. Denny (Republican) was returned to his position as Representative to Congress from the First District.

J. W. Burbach was re-elected to the state legislature from the 19th district, defeating Jess Tupper of Creighton.




