Dear FHS Families,

In light of Governor Hutchinson's recent decision to close school for on-site instruction for the remainder of the school year, this letter has important information for senior students and the Alternative Methods of Instruction (AMI) work. We have some special things planned to honor our seniors since we won't have our traditional end of the year celebrations. While we are all experiencing a new normal when it comes to educating our students, we feel as if the plan that has been established is going to provide flexibility and equity for all of our seniors.

GRADES

Fayetteville High School students' grades were reported on 3/13/2020 in a progress report. Seniors and their parents should look at grades at the end of the 3rd nine weeks (3/13/2020) and choose from the following options:

- Take the grade as of the end of the 3rd nine weeks (3/13/2020) as the final grade for the semester providing the student had a passing grade (60%-100%) at the end of the third nine weeks, OR
- Complete AMI course work/virtual work that may potentially improve their current grade.
- Students below 60% will continue with AMI work/virtual work until at a passing level in the course.

Once a decision has been made by parents and students regarding the choices above, parents will need to log into the site <u>HERE</u> using their HAC parent account username and password to indicate their decisions on course grades. PLEASE NOTE: If your child is currently taking a concurrent college course or BYU course, they are **REQUIRED** to complete the course in its entirety. Additionally, seniors enrolled in AP courses will be expected to take their online AP exams and remain in courses.
