



A Non-Fiction Text

What's the Matter? by Denise Boehm

RI.2.4

Look around the room. Everything you see is made up of *matter*, which means it takes up space.

There are three forms, or states, of matter: solid, liquid and gas. We use the properties of matter to help us decide in which group it belongs. Properties include mass, volume and shape. Mass is the amount of matter an object has. Volume is the amount of space matter takes up.

Let's start with comparing the shape of a liquid and a solid. A *solid* will keep the same shape no matter what container you put it in. However, a *liquid* will change to take shape of the container. Think of a juice glass as the solid. It stays the same shape no matter where you put it. The juice you pour into the glass is a liquid. It will take the shape of the glass if you pour it in the glass, but it would take the shape of a puddle if you poured it on the table instead.

- 1. Have a family member control the music volume
- 2. Choose another family member to wait outside of the room (so they don't peak!)
- 3. Hide an object in an easy spot somewhere around the room (something small)
- 4. Bring the family member back in the room to find the object with their ears only!
 - a. Music volume is soft if the object is far away (cold)
 - Music volume gets louder the closer they get (warmer)
 - c. Music volume is loudest when they are closest to the hidden object (hot)
