APPLICATION CHECKLIST

The following are common application requirements. Organize the information and documents you will need, and keep copies of your complete application.

- ❑ Application Form - request in writing or download from website: note deadline dates!

- ❑ Recommendations - letters or forms may be requested from
 - Faculty - teachers, instructors, professors
 - Staff – guidance counselor, home-school liaison, multicultural affairs specialist
 - Community Leaders or Professionals
 - Employer(provide a resume and/or an essay that outlines your achievements and goals.)

- ❑ Resume and/or Portfolio – include the following:
 - Extracurricular Activities
 - Athletics
 - Examples of Work – Art, Writing, etc.
 - Memberships
 - Awards
 - Test scores
 - Documentation of Tribal Enrollment or Descendancy
 - Identification
 - Photo

- ❑ Essay

Documentation you must submit to offices within the College or University:

- ❑ Financial Aid:
 - Forms indicating your financial need as determined by your FAFSA, which includes college expenses

- ❑ Admissions:
 - Letter of Acceptance

- ❑ Registrar:
 - Class Schedule or Enrollment Information
 - Transcripts – keep copies of all transcripts

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
