

What Is Title I?

Title I is a federal program providing opportunities for the children serviced to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to meet challenging state content standards.

Title I resources are distributed to schools where needs are the greatest, in amounts sufficient to make a difference in the improvement of instruction.

Title I coordinates services with other educational services and, if possible, with health and social services programs.

Title I provides greater decisional-making authority and flexibility within the school and for teachers. However, greater responsibility for student performance is the exchange made for the flexibility.

Parent's Right to Know

As a parent or guardian you have the right to request that the school provide you with information about the qualifications of your child's teacher and teachers if he/she has more than one teacher. If you would like to have this information, the district or the school will provide it for you.

You can be informed of certificate areas as well as college degrees earned. You have the know what grades and/or courses teachers are certified to teach. We can also provide you information about instructional aides that are working with your child.

School-wide Activities

The distribution of Title I funds to a school is based upon the number of students in the school who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Funds are allocated based on a yearly needs assessment, conducted by teachers' parents, community members and other stakeholders.

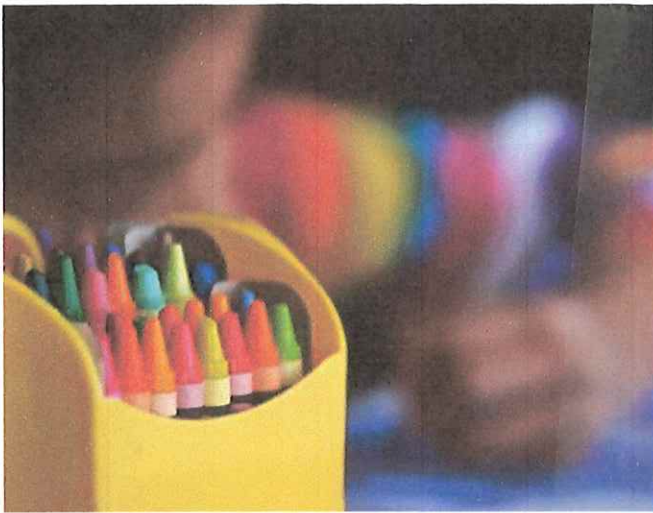
