Saranac Community Schools Board of Education Meeting #26

The regular meeting of the Saranac Community Schools Board of Education was held on Thursday, September 15, 2016 in the Cafeteria, Saranac Jr/Sr High School, 150 Pleasant Street, Saranac, MI.

The meeting was called to order by Brent Denny, President at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Coulson, Denny, Doll, Hawkins, LaWarre, Price & VanKuiken.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u>: The second grade classes led in the Pledge of Allegiance and sang a couple of patriotic songs in honor of Constitution Day. Thank you to the students and their teachers, Bridget Harder & Doris McPherson.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>: Minutes from regular meeting dated September 1 & Finance Committee meeting dated September 13, 2016 were approved as written.

<u>ADDITIONS & DELETIONS:</u> Superintendent Geiger would like to add Student Report and Finance Committee Minutes to the agenda.

<u>STUDENT REPORT</u>: Kelsey Coulier from Student Council reported they are preparing for Homecoming week with many activities. They have a senior that will be hosting as the DJ at this year's Homecoming dance. The journalism class will be publishing and online paper called the Saranac Express.

COMMENTS FROM GUESTS – AGENDA ITEMS: The Board heard public comment.

<u>BILLS PAID</u>: Motion by Coulson, supported by VanKuiken and unanimously approved that the Saranac Board of Education authorize the payment of August/September bills from General Fund totaling \$507,626.61.

<u>APPROVE NEOLA POLICIES</u>: Superintendent, Maury Geiger reported that the Board has been reviewing the NEOLA policies for the last several months and we are ready to approve and implement them.

Policy: 0000 – BYLAWS Policy: 1000 – ADMINISTRATION Policy: 2000 – PROGRAM Policy: 3000 – PROFESSIONAL STAFF Policy: 4000 – SUPPORT STAFF Policy: 5000 – STUDENTS Policy: 6000 – FINANCES Policy: 7000 – PROPERTY Policy: 8000 – OPERATIONS Policy: 9000 – RELATIONS Motion by VanKuiken, supported by LaWarre and unanimously approved that the Saranac Board of Education approve the NEOLA Policies as listed above.

<u>OUT-OF-STATE FIELD TRIP</u>: Motion by Hawkins, supported by Doll and unanimously approved that the Saranac Board of Education approve the Out-of-State Field Trip to the FFA National Convention on Thursday, October 20.

Tracy Dahms, FFA Advisor presented a short video that student Alex Graft prepared regarding a \$500 grant they received through Grow More Communities. Denny Farm planted the sweet corn from this grant. When the corn was ready the students went and picked the corn and served it to the whole student body. This turned into a volunteer project that supplied our schools and the Saranac Food Pantry.

<u>HIRE SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHER</u>: Josh Leader, JSH Principal, reported that an interview team consisting of Sara Serne, Sarah Milbratz, Patti Patton, Amy Austhof and he conducted interviews on Monday, September 12. There were five candidates that were interviewed and Mr. Leader would like to recommend Melissa Chaffins to this position.

Mr. Geiger met with Melissa on Wednesday and supports the interview teams recommendation.

Motion by LaWarre, supported by Price and unanimously approved that the Saranac Board of Education waive past board practice, and hire Melissa Chaffins as the JSH Special Education Teacher for the 2016-2017 school year.

<u>STUDENT ENROLLMENT UPDATE</u>: Superintendent, Maury Geiger reported that we currently show an enrollment of 981 students. We will continue to watch our student numbers as we get closer to the official count day of October 5.

Josh Leader, JSH Principal, presented on class sizes at the JSH. They have 7 exchange students, 3 Seat Time Waiver students and 5 GO (Graduation Option) students. They have over 200 classes online.

<u>SUPERINTENDENT'S CONTRACT</u>: School Board President, Brent Denny report at the regularly scheduled meeting on September 1, 2016, the board reviewed the updated Superintendent's Contract that the Michigan Association of School Board's attorney, Brad Banasik, provided to our district. Mr. Banasik's assistance was sought by the board, in order to address old contract language that is either not needed, or is not permitted by current laws.

In addition to the board's review of Mr. Geiger's contract language, the board also recognizes the current contract expiration date of June 30, 2017. Board President, Brent Denny, has communicated to all board members that the time has come to advise Mr. Geiger as to whether the board intends to extend the contract by one additional year, or let it expire on June 30, 2017.

Each board member was able to speak regarding Mr. Geiger, and acknowledge his hard work and dedication to our district over the past five years.

Motion by Hawkins, supported by Doll that the Saranac Board of Education allow Mr. Geiger's contract to expire on June 30, 2017 as presented. Roll Call Vote: Yes – Coulson, Denny, Doll, Hawkins, & VanKuiken. Voting No – LaWarre & Price. Motion Carried.

COMMENTS FROM GUESTS-NON AGENDA ITEMS: The Board heard public comment.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT: Superintendent Geiger reported that there will be a MiBLSi District Implementation Team Meeting at the ISD on Monday, September 19. The old district office "House" will be listed for sale next week. The Middle School has been surveyed. The website is up and running. The new computer lab at the Elementary School is replacing the Mac Lab, and has 32 units up and running thanks to the Technology Department. There is still a posting for a part-time Art Teacher at the Elementary School; and we will be posting for a part-time ELA teacher at the JSH.

Both libraries are being staffed by volunteers. They have schedules and training set up to help serve the students.

The first MASB Superintendent Evaluation training will be on September 28 at the ISD beginning at 5:30 pm. The second training will be on October 27 at Saranac JSH with our board.

BOARD REQUESTS/REPORTS: A board member wondered where the process was regarding the Consumer Energy project. Mr. Geiger has been in contact with Consumers Energy and they are working with a contractor on an agreement.

COMMUNICATIONS: None

<u>CLOSED SESSION FOR NEGOTIATIONS PURPOSES</u>: Motion by Hawkins, supported by VanKuiken that the Saranac Board of Education go into closed session at 8:40 p.m. for the purpose of negotiations planning returning to open session at 9:15 p.m. Roll Call Vote was taken: Yes Votes: Denny, Doll, Coulson, Hawkins, LaWarre, Price and VanKuiken. Motion Carried.

<u>OTHER</u>: A board member will follow-up regarding the birth rates, noting that there will be at least 2 more years of low class sizes.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, and no objection, the meeting adjourned at 9:17 p.m.

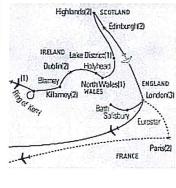
