Saranac Community Schools Board of Education Meeting #2

The regular meeting of the Saranac Community Schools Board of Education was held on Thursday, January 19, 2017 in the Library, Saranac Jr/Sr High School, 150 Pleasant Street, Saranac, MI.

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m.

Present: Courtnay, Denny, Doll, Hawkins, Jackson, Price, & VanKuiken.

Kirk Jackson led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES:</u> Minutes from regular meeting dated January 5, and special meeting dated January 12, 2017 were approved as presented.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report for December was accepted as presented.

ADDITIONS & DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA: None

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COMMENTS FROM GUESTS – AGENDA ITEMS: The Board heard public comment.

STUDENT REPORT: Dakota Ostrander from Student Council reported they held their annual Mock Rock with 28 acts performing; 1st Place - Spencer McPherson, 2nd Place - Flavia Marcello, and 3rd Place was a small orchestra ensemble of students. Wednesday they held their 2nd blood drive of the year with 52 signed up. On February 4 they will be holding their "Snow Coming Dance". Student Council will be helping with Special Olympics in Traverse City on February 2.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: Jr/Sr High Principal, Josh Leader reported the JSH finally finished exams after many delays. On Monday the teachers had a Ed Camp Style professional development led by Amy Frias. Teacher, Keith Houston and his high school Drama class performed their musical, "The Fearsome Pirate Frank," for the JSH last Friday. The students also held an evening performance and raised over \$300.00 for set supplies and script costs. Thank you to all who attended, Barb Pachulski of Signature Photography for photographing the event, and Mr. Houston for volunteering his time.. Former MSU basketball player and current public speaker Anthony Ianni will speak to students on January 25th about positive self-image and the impacts of bullying. Thank you to teacher, Phyllis Plumley for arranging this opportunity. The PAC group raised enough funds to purchase 18 TI-calculators for the JSH.

Elementary Principal, Jason Smith reported the elementary is planning the kindergarten parent meeting for Monday, March 13th. The elementary has formed a committee to work on school environment and behavior. This committee is part of the state MiBLSi program that the district has joined. The committees are being led by Amy Frias, MTSS Coordinator/Behavior specialist. The elementary appreciates Mary Bouck for coming in to lead our math Professional Development day on January 16th. March is Reading month and planning is underway, we

welcome all volunteers and folks who would like to visit as a guest reader. Thanks to Karen Rohrer for working to secure grants to assist the PE department in updating equipment.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Mr. Geiger reported we have used 5 of 6 snow days so far that the State allows. The district MiBLSi teams are receiving extensive training. February 28 there will be a County-wide Board Workshop held at the ISD. April 25 there will be a Legislative Retreat in Lansing. On Monday, January 23 there is a District Strategic Planning community meeting on Facilities and Technology. Mr. Geiger thanked Chuck Prins for all his hard work on the buses as we recently passed our bus inspections. Monday, January 16^{th,} all the special education teachers met with Renee Thelen, Special Education Planner/Monitor from the ISD, and received a half-day of professional development on special education practices & procedures. Mr. Geiger thanked the board members who have signed up for the mid-winter MASB workshops held at Kent ISD.

BOARD REQUESTS/REPORTS: A board member would like to have MASB provide a course on the Superintendent Selection. The board member would also like to have Mr. Geiger explore the idea of some type of cooperative agreement with Ionia or Lowell through GRCC, MCC or LCC for classes and partnering for some AP classes. The board member would also like Mr. Geiger to look into the 2nd grade class sizes.

A board member thought it was an excellent idea to hear about having the elementary and middle school student councils along with the high school to attend board meetings to give updates on what kind of things students are doing in their buildings.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS:</u> A card was passed around received from staff for School Board Appreciation Month.

<u>APPROVE EXECUTIVE SESSION MINUTES:</u> The board approved the Executive Session Minutes dated January 5, and 12, 2017 as written.
