TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report for April was accepted as presented.

<u>COMMENTS FROM GUESTS – AGENDA ITEMS:</u> The Board heard public comment.

<u>APPROVE CONSENT ACTION ITEMS:</u> Motion by Coulson, supported by LaWarre and unanimously approved that the Saranac Board of Education accept the Consent Agenda Items as presented:

<u>APPROVE TEACHERS PARTIAL LEAVE OF ABSENCE:</u> We have notified both teachers and have received their responses, Tina Catrell & Tara Rasmus for the 2016-2017 school year. This request can be handled in one of two ways.

- 1. Agree to the request as submitted. This will allow the teacher to continue to work half time but have the right to request to return to full time at the end of the year.
- 2. Deny the request. This will require the teacher to either return to full time employment next year or resign half of their position and become a half time teacher. This would only entitle them to half time employment in future years.

Motion by LaWarre, supported by Doll and unanimously approved that the Saranac Board of Education approve the part-time leave of absence for the two employees for the 2016-2017 school year.

NEOLA POLICY 4000(SUPPORT STAFF) AND 5000 (STUDENTS) 2ND READING:

The board reviewed the 2nd reading of these two sections of policy, and these will be brought back at a later date for a 3rd review and approval.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT: Superintendent Geiger reported that Connie Hamilton, Curriculum Director applied for two grants and received both of them. One of the grants was for \$13,695 for Targeted Literacy Instruction and Interventions. This will provide additional instructional time to students in grades K-3 who need interventions in reading. The second one is MIBLSI (Michigan's Integrated Behavior and Learning Support Initiative) grant to provide intensive training on creating a multi-tiered system of support for behavior and reading in grades K-12.

Mr. Geiger updated the board on the Consumers Energy project.

The Saranac Promise Committee has updated their brochure, and there are 40 students who will receive scholarships this year from the Saranac Promise.

It is a condition for participation in any MHSAA postseason tournaments that high schools adhere to at least the minimum standards of Regulation I and the maximum limitations of Regulation II in ALL MHSAA Tournament sports.

Michigan High School Athletic Association tournaments are the collective property of the MHSAA and not of any individual member school. The MHSAA reserves the right to promote and advance the membership's interests with publication information; exclusive arrangements to create recognition and exposure for school-sponsored activities; restrictive policies prohibiting exploitation and commercialization of MHSAA-sponsored tournaments; appropriate proprietary interests, and the use of images or transmissions identifying contest officials, spectators and member schools' students, personnel and marks.

To obtain membership, it is necessary for the Board of Education/Governing Body to adopt the following resolution for its junior high/middle and senior high schools. NOTE: Pursuant to the MHSAA Constitution, all high schools, junior high/middle schools, or other schools of Michigan doing a grade of work corresponding to such schools, may become members of this organization provided (a) the school building has enrollment and onsite attendance of at least 15 students, whether for grades 6 through 8 or 9, or grades 9 or 10 through 12; and (b) if a nonpublic school, the school qualifies for federal income tax exemption as a not-for-profit organization. To reach the 15-student minimum for middle school membership, schools may join the MHSAA at the 6th-grade level whether or not 6th-grade students participate in athletics.

A. This Section does not require school districts to become member schools at the junior high/middle school level and does not require school districts to sponsor any interscholastic athletics for 6th grade students.

B. If a school district's MHSAA Membership Resolution lists a junior high/middle school as an MHSAA member school, and if the school sponsors a 6th-grade team in any sport or permits a 6th-grade student to participate with 7th- and/or 8th-grade students in any sport, then all of Regulations III and IV apply to all 6th-graders in all sports involving 6th-graders on teams sponsored by that school. If the school does not allow any 6th-graders to participate in a sport, MHSAA rules do not apply in that sport.
