#### To Whom It May Concern:

My name is James McRae and I am applying for the Secondary High School Social Studies Teacher opening at Saranac Junior/Senior High School. I am a 2011 graduate of Albion College's teacher education program (rated "exemplary" by the Michigan Department of Education) with a concentration in secondary education, with Michigan teaching certifications in social studies, history, and political science. According to your website: "Saranac Community Schools through its strong community involvement, will provide an education for all students which enables them to become contributing, productive members of society." With my record of excellent educational outcomes, teaching flexibility, and my experience in community and extra-curricular activities, I believe I would be an ideal fit for your school. I would love to discuss my qualifications, such as:

- Experience at teaching successfully, even in difficult environments. From September of 2013 until the end of the school year, I was the long term substitute teacher for math and science at the Eaton County Youth Facility for youths in the criminal justice system. Despite teaching outside my certification areas, I was successful not only in planning and implementing lessons, units, and performing the duties expected of a classroom teacher, I also designed an entirely new curriculum for remedial math, and a majority of my students showed improvements of more than one grade level per school year on Woodcock-Johnson education assessments.
- Excellent subject knowledge and deep social studies background including AP experience. I have been consistently praised by my mentors for having very deep subject knowledge in all facets of social studies. I strongly believe that in order for students to become "contributing, productive members of society" they must have a nuanced understanding of the workings of the world around them.
- Experience successfully leading extra-curricular activities. For the past three years I have been the assistant director of theatre for Charlotte High School. In this capacity I have helped direct three musicals, three plays, and I have personally directed three plays including *The Great Gatsby* this past spring which Mark Colson, professor of media acting at Michigan State University rated as well above the average level of theatre performance at most high schools. I understand the need at a small school for high levels of staff involvement in extracurricular and community activities and I would be more than willing to lead and direct these.
- **Differentiation of instruction to students across a wide range of ability levels.** In my time at the Eaton County Youth Facility I was the sole teacher of both math and science, teaching two classrooms of math, and one of science. These classrooms included students taking courses ranging from middle school math to Algebra II, Earth Science to Chemistry and Physics, and with reading levels in some cases lower than 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. I made adaptations to allow all students to succeed.
- Classroom management of students who had prior behavior problems, and struggled previously with academics. Many of my students at the Eaton County Youth Facility came to us with mostly failing grades, some who had been out of school for years at a time despite not being even sixteen years old, and most of our students were diagnosed with either a learning disability, or an emotional impairment. My first priority for these students was establishing a routine with clear expectations, and a clear incentive/disincentive structure. Once students became comfortable in the routine, my patience, relentless positivity, refusal to let them fail, and dedication to helping each student individually allowed them to see themselves be successful, and then build on that success moving forward.
- Commitment to professional development. I have attended the Learn Today Teach Tomorrow conference for preservice teachers from 2008-2011, including as a speaker on a panel of student teachers. I have also attended the annual Michigan Reading Association Conference, and the Michigan Conference for Social Studies where I presented on "Integrating History and Geography" with colleagues from Albion. While student teaching, I attended in-service trainings for "Kagan Cooperative Learning" and incorporated cooperative activities and diverse teaching styles into my curriculum. It is my hope to be a regular attendee and participant at the MCSS as I develop my professional career.
