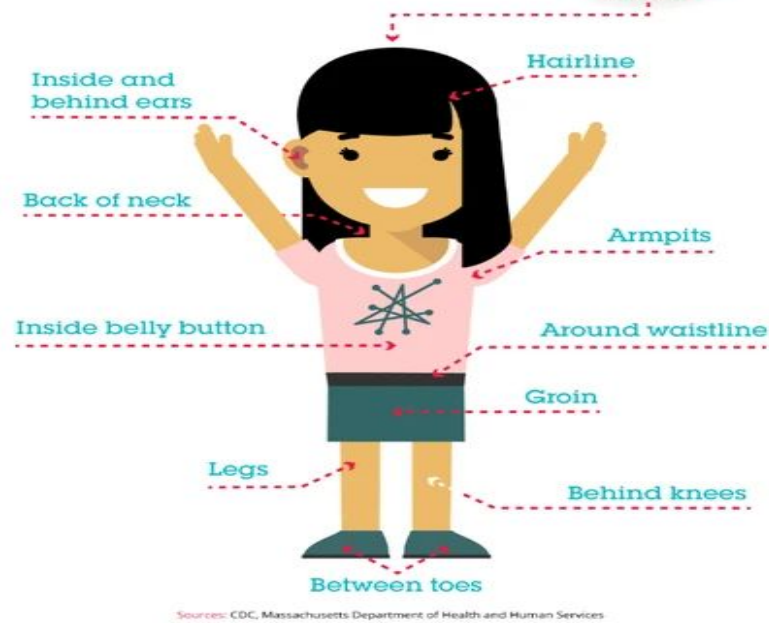


Where to check for **TICKS**

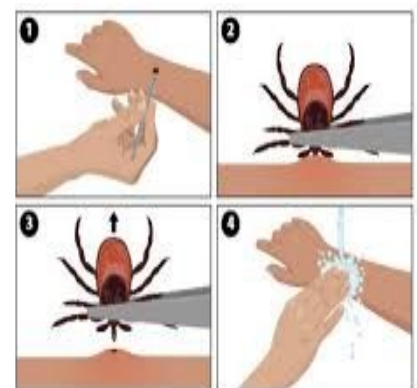


It's Spring and the weather is finally nice and kids should be outside playing. Remember that social distancing is important and there should not be playdates at this time.



Of course, the nice weather brings out the ticks!! When your child comes in from outside check them carefully for any ticks. This is important so that you can remove the tick before it has had a chance to bite and attach itself to your child.

If you find a tick attached: Avoid folklore remedies such as “painting” the tick with nail polish or petroleum jelly, or using heat to make the tick detach from the skin. Your goal is to remove the tick as quickly as possible—not waiting for it to detach. Remember to always contact your child’s Health Care Provider with any questions.
