### Daily Basics

- Number, Color, or Shape: Bring out the Red Color Display from your Teacher Pack and place if on the shaded polor area of the Display Base. Introduce the Spanish word for red, role (ROH-hoh). Is anyone wearing red today?
- Alphabet Fun: Show the Letter A Display (in Teacher Pack) to the children. Practice making the long and short is/ sounds. Point to the upper and lowercase letters, introduce the sign language symbol. Ask children, "What letter A tem is pictured on the display?" Show the Letter A Word Carde to the children. Ask them to name the picture on each card. If children are unfamiliar with an item, introduce it to them.

Friends at School

Welcome children to a new school year by inviting them to play school We meet and play with lots of friends at school. Can the children name some friends they have met so far at your setting? Have them name things that might be found in achool. Ask, "What do we do with these here?

Add school-wisted items to an area where a small group of children can play and pretend Suggested materials include a white board, dry-ense markers, a computer, books, an easel, baper, crayons, stickers, backpacks, palculators, previous or markers, folders, apples, and a small deak or table. Invite children to take turns being the leacher and afudents.

Does anyone have family members who attend achool during the day? Are there any children who were in your setting, but now are at a different school? Talk about where those mission a sibling or friend who is not here with them. Take time to talk about the children's feelings I Offer past photo albums to reminisce about old Mends or create a new album filled "Our Friends" to showcase all the children currently at your setting.

## Registration Requirements

- Child must be four years old by December 1, 2022.
- Completed Online Registration
- Signed contract
- Non-refundable \$15 registration fee
- Certified birth certificate. Hospital certificate with the hands and feet are not accepted.
- Proof of residency
- Up-to-date immunization records
- 4-year old physical completed by physician
  - If your child's birthday falls after school starts it is okay for you to wait till their birthday before having the physical completed.
- The first two weeks will be considered probationary. During this time the parent or teacher may remove a child from the program if it appears that the program is not meeting their needs.
