1. Old Business

- **Review of Wellness Policy and Wellness Plan/Tim VanCleave; the rubric has not yet been received; a SHAC subcommittee will be formed in the Spring to work on the Wellness Policy.**

2. New Business/Reports

■ School Foodservice Update/Sharla Porter

TDA school foodservice audit went well; Thanksgiving meals will be served Tues/Wed/Thursday next week and will include the standard menu from previous years; TDA requires a 21 day menu; recently adjustments have been made to the menu to accommodate Robinson school kids and preferences; in December we will have new menus for spring semester that were reviewed by the Principals; grocery availability/inflation making substitutions more common; Sysco is the food distributor and they are working to make sure substitutions meet requirements.

■ Campus Safety/Traffic Issues/Abel Sanchez

Abel reporting no traffic issues; all running smoothly; behind Intermediate school parents are driving around the buses where kids are going out to parent cars; solution may be to block off areas that cars are going through; buses running well.

■ Waco/McLennan County Health Dept; AgriLife/Colleen Foleen and Ashley Cox reported on the healthy campus program.

Information on healthy school campus; goal is to encourage healthier eating and more physical activity; required to have one youth program and one adult program; reward is banner and proclamation; Elementary campus has already initiated the program. Mr. VanCleave will get info to principals for further participation.

■ Community Garden/Green Classroom/Brandi Cox/Amanda Marshall/Ruth Wedemeyer

It was determined that the pond bog is needing replacement; Mr. VanCleave met with Ruth, Harvey Peterson and Chris Kemp to evaluate and they are currently looking at options to pay for rebuilding the bog; Amanda is looking at grants...after Thanksgiving if no grants available then District can consider funding the replacement project.

■ Region 12/School Health/Laura Bearden

1-2 covid cases (decreased) but flu and strep cases very high; in the school flu clinic, 111 vaccines were given; diabetes classes completed; vision screening and scoliosis screening being completed now; immunization report due to the state; still trying to get epipens and now have Narcan supply; will check to see if policy and procedure needed for Narcan administration; will have a new option of a Fannie pack with emergency supplies for each health office; Ms. Teichelman will be retiring in December after 20 years; interviews are currently occurring for her position.

■ Technology/Website/Bryan Fuqua is at training. No new information.

■ Safety/David Wrzesinski

We now have all doors updated/secure and working well and there will be an audit occurring in next couple of weeks; staff is doing a good job of making sure all doors are locked; the District is considering the addition of more cameras at junior high; the state has 2 grants that could pay for

raptor system, cameras and storage and will also improve some of the doors; during Thanksgiving lunches, staff will try to minimize presence of outside people on campus; we will have them come in the side door and then back out without moving through the buildings.
