While this is a closing of our school buildings, I want to assure you that this does not mean the end of education and services for your child. As a district and staff, we remain committed to supporting our Bangor students by continuing virtual learning, providing meals for students, planning for the remainder of the year, and beginning to plan for summer school as well as the start of school next fall.

While all of us wish we could be in school physically, we will continue to work to provide the best educational opportunities we can for your child. I know that your child's teacher(s) along with Mr. Johnson, our elementary principal, and Mr. Muellenberg, our middle/high school principal, will continue to reach out to you to inform you of your child's learning as we all learn together how to best use and navigate virtual learning.

We will continue to provide and deliver lunches Monday through Thursday to our students through the remainder of the year. Finally, due to the school closure, the date for graduation is now **Saturday, August 1 at 1:00**. We are hopeful that date works in terms of timing, but also for the safety and health of this year's graduating seniors, their families and friends so we can celebrate the accomplishments of the Class of 2020.

As you know this is an extremely challenging and unprecedented time for everyone. But I know that we have a wonderful school and community of students, parents, and staff that care deeply for each other. We will get through this together and come out stronger for it.
