

# School Parent and Family Engagement Policy Harper Elementary School 2020-2021 Revised: April 24, 2020

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, <u>Harper Elementary School</u> receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy that contains information required by section 1116(b) and (c) of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). - (C) Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child
- (D) Other activities are carried out, such as those described in Section 1116 of the ESSA

## JOINTLY DEVELOPED
