## **2019-2020 End of Year Activities Question and Answers**

### **Will we have a graduation ceremony?**

If the governor allows for large gatherings, we will still have the traditional graduation ceremony. While this does not seem to be likely by May 24th, Illini Central High School is looking to host an alternative graduation plan. Tentative plans would ask that all graduates participate in a parade beginning at the Mason City Christian Church parking lot and then travel by police and fire truck escort through Mason City, Easton, and San Jose. The parade will conclude at Illini Central High School where students will receive their diploma. As we get closer to the May 24th date of graduation, more information will be shared.

### **When is the last day for seniors?**

The last day for remote learning for seniors on track for graduation is May 15th. All grades and coursework must be completed by this date.

### **Will we have the 8th grade Commitment to Graduation Ceremony?**

We will still hold this ceremony, but we will not host it until fall in conjunction with Freshman Orientation. As of now, this date is tentatively set for August 12, 2020.

### **Will we have a prom?**

No, unfortunately, prom will be canceled. We cannot find a way to make this work within the constraints in place by the Center for Disease Control.

### **Will we have an awards ceremony?**

Yes, we will conduct the high school awards ceremony online. With the delay of deadlines for many scholarships, we are still waiting to set a date. Watch the website for more information.

### **Will we have final exams in the high school?**

No, we will not have final exams for any student. Students are expected to do all of the work through remote learning. Grades from remote learning can only improve students' grades. Students who do not meet expectations for remote learning completion will be given an incomplete and expected to do the work upon return. Students' third quarter grades were completed prior to leaving on March 13th. Students who improve their grades during remote learning will have their fourth quarter grades averaged with their third quarter grade for their semester grade. For example, a student who earned a 70% third quarter, but through remote learning earned a 80% during fourth quarter will have a semester grade of 75%. A student who earned a 70% during third quarter, but a 65% during fourth quarter will end with a 70% for the semester grade.
