#### F. Communications

- 1. NEAS&C
  - i. The NEASC Commission on Public Schools, at its June 26-27, 2022 meeting, voted to accept the Five-Year Progress Report of Sanford High School and to continue the school's accreditation.

While the report described many positive aspects of the school, the Commission was pleased to learn of the following:

#### 9.19.22

- The formal policy on cell phone usage during academic time to help address the ethical use of technology.
- The effective use of the two hours of professional development time each week to work interdepartmentally and with the Sanford Regional Technical Center to help provide experimental learning and increase relevancy in high school classrooms
- The implementation of restorative circles and the Character Strong program to address student's social-emotional needs
- The partnerships with the new director and new assistant director of maintenance and the development of a long-range plan top ensure regulsrly scheduled maintenance of systems and facilities completed quarterly and annually
- The plan and process to evaluate the core values for the school while in the process of reviewing the 21<sup>st</sup> century skills and rubrics
- The creation of a system of data collection and analysis of both formative and summative assessments practiced in different subject area to respond to inequities in student achievement
- The development of common assessments by grade level, and the use of professional development time to score and review common assessments to evaluate the overall impact on instruction

The school is scheduled to host its Decennial Accreditation visit in the calendar year 2028.

The school's next Accreditation cycle will begin in the fall of 2025 (three years prior to the decennial visit.)

#### 2. Nutrition Review

- Representatives from the Maine Department of Education are scheduled to conduct an Administrative Review and Procurement Review of the Sanford School Department Nutrition Department. These reviews are now on a five-year cycle and are conducted concurrently.
  - The reviewer will be onsite sometime during the week of 12.13.2023.

  - Open House was phenomenal
  - 2 Fire Drills experienced; lockdowns forth coming
  - Service Dog program continues to grow; Bentley spends time in the Kindergarten and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade classrooms. Other than Bentley, there are four other service dogs in place that do specific roles with Guidance, Social Worker and in self-contained rooms.
  - Fortunate to have Foster Grandparents back; there are four this year (one in the K looping classroom, one in the 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> grade looping classroom and two in 1<sup>st</sup> grade classrooms).

  - Looking to add one kitchen personnel to accommodate additional Pre-K room.
- 4. Stacey Bissell, Special Education Director
  - i. Bridge/Special Education Update
    - 11<sup>th</sup> year; first year to expand into service grades 2 to 12.
    - Staff together for 10 years; nervous about new comers and how it would go. However, no worry was needed. The staff all came together, developed a group text and are already figuring it out. Their dedication is special.
    - Special development was first task.
      - Introduced group dynamics and step ladders; promotes team work
      - Introduced the leadership wheel team should fill the wheel; activity was successful.
      - Lead into development of staff code of cooperation; same exercise students are asked to do
      - Agreed to treat each other with respect, kindness and understand we are all humans that make mistakes
      - Agreed to closing the loop and being open to other perspectives.
      - Theme: We are Stronger Together!
