



## Marketing & Social Media, A Risk Factor

For \$1 the alcohol industry spends on youth advertising, youth drink 3% more each month.


American teens on social networking sites daily are 5x likelier to use tobacco, 3x likelier to use alcohol & 2x as likely to use marijuana compared to those who don't.

Maine law states that advertisements cannot involve mass-market advertising/campaigns that have a high likelihood of reaching persons under 21 years of age.






## **Marijuana Perception of Harm**

How much do you think people risk harming themselves


(physically or in other ways) if they use marijuana once or twice a week?



of <u>all</u> high school students in Maine




## Marijuana Access & Use



- of Sanford High School students reported that it would be easy or very easy to get marijuana. (State Average 47%)
- of Sanford Middle School students reported using marijuana at least once. (State Average 7%)
- of Sanford High School students reported using marijuana at least once. (State Average 31%)

## Perception of Harm, Access, & Age of 1st Alcohol Consumption




of Sanford High School students reported that it would be easy or very easy to get alcohol. (Down from 58% in 2019)

of Sanford High School students reported consuming alcohol other than a few sips did so before the age of 13. (Down from 14% in 2019)

## Perception of Harm, Rx


How much do you think people risk harming themselves (physically or in other ways) if they take a prescription drug that is not prescribed to them?

## **Bullying**

45% of Sanford Middle School students were bullied on school property in the past year.

2017: 48% 2019: 58%

Statewide: 41%

2021-

20% of Sanford High School students were bullied on school property in the past year. (23% SHS Students reported electronic bullying)



## **Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)**

Adverse Childhood Experiences are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood

#### **Protective Factors**

Students agree that at least one of their teachers really cares about them and gives them support when needed.

of SHS students agree that they feel like they matter to their community, compared to 52% of high school students statewide.

49%

of SMS students agree that they feel like they matter to their community, compared to 55% of middle school students statewide.

## **Important Data Points to Take Away**

- ✓ Higher rate of depression 37% and suicidal ideation 25% at SMS compared to middle school students statewide 30%, 20%. SHS also reported a higher rate of depression at 39% compared to high school students statewide 36%.
- √ 8% of SMS students and 21% of SHS students reported using an electronic vape device in the past 30 days. This rate is significantly higher compared to 4% of middle school students and 17% of high school students statewide.
- ✓ 29% of SHS students who have tried marijuana tried before the age 13. This rate is significantly higher compared to 19% of high school students statewide.
- √ 5% of SHS students reported housing instability (anything other than "In my parents or guardians home"). This rate is significantly higher compared to 2% of high school students statewide.
