Why Career and Technical Education (CTE)?

- The Maine economy is experiencing a skills gap...
 - 51% of jobs in Maine require skills training— more education than high school but less than a four-year degree.
 - 47% of Maine workers are trained at this level.

Career and technical education (CTE) programs can fill these gaps.

- The 4 year cohort graduation rate in Maine is 95.9% for CTE Concentrators and 86.1% for all students.
- During the 2020-2021 school year, Maine had 7677 secondary level CTE students and 7813 post-secondary CTE (community college, trade school) students.
