ONLINE REGISTRATION OPEN MARCH 1 - 31

Registration must be completed online by April I, 2021 by logging into your student's TeacherEase account. See page 2 for directions.

Payment may be made through your student's TeacherEase account either at the time of registration or by making payments throughout the summer. Online payments will have a convenience fee applied. You may also pay by cash or check by stopping in your student's school office so that you can be given a receipt.

Registration fees are as follows:

There may be additional fees for high school students.

Middle School sports fee is \$40 per sport and High School sports fee is \$75 per sport. There is a maximum sports fee per family of \$400. Please notify your student's building secretary when you have reached the maximum fee. Your student's account will then be adjusted accordingly.

All sports and registration fees must be paid before the student will be permitted to participate in sports practices or attend extracurricular events.

Pre-K and Kindergarten students can be registered online when registering your returning student(s). Please contact JRW Elementary if you have any questions.

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ONLINE REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

ONLINE REGISTRATION IS OPEN MARCH I THROUGH MARCH 31. PAYMENT IS DUE BY AUGUST 1, 2021. PAYMENT MAY BE MADE THROUGH YOUR STUDENT'S TEACHEREASE ACCOUNT EITHER AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION OR BY MAKING PAYMENTS THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER. IF YOU FORGOT YOUR PASSWORD OR HAVE NOT LOGGED INTO TEACHEREASE IN THE PAST, GO TO WWW.TEACHEREASE.COM, ENTER YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS THAT IS ON FILE, AND CLICK ON FORGOT PASSWORD. THIS ALLOWS YOU TO SET UP A PASSWORD FOR YOUR ACCOUNT.

Before you begin the registration process, you should gather the following information:

- 1. Your student's doctor and dentist names, addresses, and telephone numbers.
- 2. The names and telephone numbers of two people who will serve as emergency contacts for your child in case a parent/guardian cannot be reached in an emergency.

STEP ONE - REGISTRATION (MANDATORY):

- I. Log into TeacherEase.
- 2. On the main screen under Miscellaneous, choose Online Registration.
- 3. On Step 1 choose complete form.
- 4. You must verify or answer the information on all the tabs. When finished with the first one, either click on the next tab or the next button to continue. Do this after completing the information on each tab.
- 5. Do not leave fields blank. If a question does not pertain to your student, please enter NA.
- 6. Make sure to select "Save". If you do not save the information and leave the website, all of the information you entered will be lost and you will have to complete all steps again.
- 7. You will have to do the entire process for each student you are registering to attend.
- 8. If you wish to pay registration fees online, you can continue by clicking on Pay Registration Fees. Grades 6-12 can also select and pay additional fees that are due. For High School students, please make sure to include band, art, driver's education, and IVCC fees.

STEP TWO - HEALTH HISTORY (MANDATORY):

- 1. Select 2021-2022 Student Health History.
- 2. Print out the form, complete, sign, and return to your student's school. This must be received by August 1, 2021.

STEP THREE - SPORTS FORM (IF APPLICABLE):

- 1. Select 2021-2022 Sports Form (if your student in Grades 6-12 is participating in a sport).
- 2. Print out the form, complete, sign, and return to your student's school. This must be received by August 1, 2021.

STEP FOUR - VEHICLE REGISTRATION (IF APPLICABLE):

- 1. Select 2021-2022 Vehicle Registration (if your student in Grades 10-12 needs a parking permit).
- 2. Print out the form, complete, sign, and return to your student's school. This must be received by August 1, 2021.

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FROM THE NURSE

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

The Health Office welcomes you to a new school year. Please use the information in this letter to prepare for the upcoming school year by scheduling appointments early to avoid the rush prior to the start of school. Please feel free to reach any of the districts health offices if you have any questions and/or concerns by calling 815.498.2338, ext. 1330.

All physical examination and immunization requirements are due by August 19, 2021.

Per Board of Education Policy 7:100, unless an exemption or extension applies, the failure to comply with the below requirements by October 15th of the current school year will result in the student's exclusion from school until the required health forms are presented to the District. New students who register after October 15th of the current school year shall have 30 days following registration to comply with the health examination and immunization regulations. If a medical reason prevents a student from receiving a required immunization by October 15th, the student must present, by October 15th, an immunization schedule and a statement of the medical reasons causing the delay. The schedule and statement of medical reasons must be signed by the physician, advanced practice nurse, physician assistant, or local health department responsible for administering the immunizations.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS

The State of Illinois requires physical examinations for students entering Pre-K, Kindergarten, Sixth Grade, and Ninth Grade. The examination must have taken place within one year prior to the first day of school and documented on the School Physical Form.

IMMUNIZATIONS

All immunizations that are required by the Illinois Department of Public Health, including the month/day/year and correct number of doses at the correct intervals, must be verified by a health care provider. Parents/Guardians who object to examination(s) or immunization(s) on religious grounds are not required to submit their child or wards to either, provided they present a completed Illinois Certificate of Religious Exemption form. This form must be completed in its entirety by the parent/guardian and signed by the physician, advanced practice nurse, or physician assistant performing the examination. The statement must set forth the specific religious belief which conflicts with the examination(s) and/or immunization(s). Each vaccine that is objected must be listed.

DENTAL EXAMINATIONS

The State of Illinois requires dental examinations for students entering Kindergarten, Second Grade, Sixth Grade, and Ninth Grade. The examination must have taken place on or after November 15th of the previous school year, documented on the Illinois School Dental Examination Form by a licensed dentist and is due prior to May 15th of the current school year.

EYE EXAMINATIONS

The State of Illinois requires eye examinations for students entering Kindergarten as well as students entering Illinois schools for the first time. The examination must have taken place on or after October 15th of the previous school year and documented on the Illinois Eye Examination Report.

STUDENTS TRANSFERRING INTO SOMONAUK #432 SCHOOLS

Students coming from another Illinois school have 30 days to provide copies of mandated health requirements. Students coming from out of state or out of country have 30 days to provide proof of a physical examination completed within the last 12 months and contains all State of Illinois examination requirements, all State of Illinois vaccine requirements, and proof of an eye examination which was completed within the last 12 months. Students entering the Illinois school system at the Kindergarten level or higher for the first time are required to have the eye examination regardless of grade level. If a child transfers in from out of state, out of country, or homeschooling and have never before been in the Illinois system, the eye examination would be required.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS FOR SPORTS PARTICIPATION

Sports examinations are required annually for students wanting to try out and participate in sports in Sixth through Twelfth grades. The mandated Department of Human Services form required for Sixth and Ninth grades will meet the sports requirement. The IHSA form will not meet mandated physical requirements.

SCHOOL BOARD INFORMATION

MEETINGS

The Regular Board of Education Meeting is the third Monday of each month beginning at 7:00 pm in the Somonauk High School Library. Dates, agenda, and minutes of meetings are on the district website. The public is always invited to attend meetings.

Board members are elected to serve staggered four year terms.

Tom Nielsen was originally appointed to fill a vacant seat in 2005 and was re-elected in April 2019, and is currently the Secretary.

Corey Britt was originally appointed to fill a vacant seat in 2012 and was re-elected in April 2017.

Nick Deacon was originally appointed to fill a vacant seat in 2019.

Norm Johnson was originally appointed to fill a vacant seat in 2014 and was re-elected in April 2017.

Amy Wiegman was elected in 2013 and was re-elected in April 2017.

TRANSPORTATION

BUS ROUTES

Bus routes for the 2021-2022 school year should be very similar to the current routes. Parents will be notified if there are any major changes. Information collected from registration will be used to set up the bus routes with any needed changes.

Any parent requesting an alternate pickup or drop off location (this can only be one location) must complete a request form that can be picked up in any of the school offices or found on the District website. This form must be submitted for approval no less than 48 hours prior to the requested start date. Approval is based on student counts on the buses.

TRAFFIC PATTERNS

FOR THE SAFETY OF THE STUDENTS, please do not use the bus drop off and pickup lanes. Vehicles should follow the flow of traffic and NOT cut through parking spaces.

NOTICE OF RECORD DESTRUCTION

Somonauk School District will destroy special education records from school years prior to and including the 2014-2015 school year for students who graduated from or transferred out of Somonauk CUSD #432.

Parents of students under 18 or students aged 18 or older who wish to obtain the records or have questions may call the district office at 815.498.2315 ext. 1224 before May 31, 2021 between the hours of 7:30 am and 4:00 pm. Copies of the rules and regulations that govern student records are available for inspection in the district office.

INDIAN VALLEY VOCATIONAL CENTER (IVVC)

IVVC is our area's cooperative vocational school located in Sandwich. High School Juniors and Seniors have the option to study occupational courses at IVVC. Somenauk School District is one of the eleven participating school districts at IVVC, which covers students in four counties. Students may choose from several different programs including automotive, building trades, computer repair/programming, teaching methods, cosmetology, drafting, fire science, food service, graphic arts, health occupations, sports medicine, construction, welding, and law enforcement.

COLLECTION PROCEDURE FOR BILLS NOT PAID

Students are responsible for returning all school property that they rent or use and for payment of any fees related to such rental or use. This includes, but is not limited to textbooks (rental fees and lost or damaged books), chrome books, library materials, lunch money, sport and band uniforms, school picture money, damaged school property, and/or any other school property that the staff or administration deems damaged, lost, not returned, or unpaid by a student. Upon notification, the student shall have thirty (30) days to pay for the bill or return the property in satisfactory condition. Contact the school office if a payment plan is needed.

If said property is not paid in full, the student will not be eligible for any extra-curricular activities. This includes, but is not limited to attending or participating in sports, club organizations, dances, field trips, and the commencement ceremonies. All bills must be paid prior to the last day of school.

LUNCHES

DIRECT CERTIFICATION

Students who are direct certified through assistance from the State of Illinois through SNAP, TANF, or Income-Based Eligible Medicaid, are automatically qualified for free lunches and in association with that eligibility, will have their registration and most school fees waived. Families with foster children may be eligible for benefits regardless of household income. The school districts throughout Illinois receive the lists approximately July 1st of each year. Decisions on free/reduced lunches and fee waivers through the direct certification process will not be applied to your students account until that list is received by Somonauk School District. It could take up to two weeks after July 1st for direct certification status to be applied to individual student accounts. You will receive notification from us when your student's account has been changed to reflect direct certification status, along with notification of the fee waiver either through an email or through USPS mail.

The direct certification list is sent out the first of every month throughout the school year. Once your student qualifies as direct certified, that status remains in place for the entire school year.

FREE AND REDUCED LUNCHES

If your student is not direct certified by August 1st, you will need to fill out an online application for Free/Reduced lunches. Free or reduced lunch eligibility is based on total household income and proof of eligibility must be provided to the school district. Only one application is needed for the entire family and you must complete a new application each school year. Any applications received that are not dated for the 2021-2022 school year must be denied and you will be notified.

These applications are not made available to the District until August Ist. You may apply after that date or at any time throughout the school year if you have a change such as a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, become unemployed, or receive SNAP, TANF, or Medicaid eligible benefits for your child(ren). In the operation of the free lunch program, no child will be discriminated against because of color, national origin, sex, age, or disability.

HOT LUNCHES

Students may either purchase their lunch at school through the hot lunch program or bring a sack lunch from home. Students with sack lunches may purchase a carton of milk or ala carte items. Outside lunches are not allowed to be brought in (McDonald's, Casey's, etc). Monthly menus are available on the district website.

Deposits can be made online through TeacherEase or turned in before school. Lunch money must be deposited into their lunch accounts and a pin number will be used as they go through the lunch line. There will be no deposits accepted in the lunch lines. Grades 5-12 are offered ala carte items for lunch and prices vary depending on the menu.

ANNUAL ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN NOTICE

It has been determined by the IL Department of Public Health and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency that asbestos is a potential health hazard, and precautions should be taken to avoid disturbing any asbestos containing materials.

As required, our buildings were initially inspected for asbestos. The AHERA law requires that a visual surveillance of asbestos containing areas be completed every six months, and a reinspection conducted every three years.

Anyone interested in being notified when the Somonauk School District Building and Grounds Department plans to spray pesticides must register their name with the District Office at 815.498.2315.

RIGHT TO REQUEST STUDENTS CLASSROOM TEACHERS QUALIFICATIONS

As a parent or guardian of a student at a school receiving funds under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (JRW), you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child and the paraprofessionals, if any, who assist them. Federal law gives you the right to receive the following information about each of your student's classroom teachers and their paraprofessional assistants, if any:

- Whether Illinois has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status by which State licensing criteria have been waived.
- The teacher's college major.
- Whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

If you would like to receive any of this information, please contact the school office.

NOTIFICATION OF STUDENTS RIGHTS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records:

- I. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parents or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parents or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading. The parents or eligible student may ask Somonauk CUSD #432 to amend records that they believe are inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parents or eligible student, the District will notify the parents or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parents or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- 3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
- 4. The right to file a complaint with the US Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The address of the Office that administers FERPA is:
