Talk about the color green with your child. Find objects and pictures that are green. Describe what they are and talk about them with your child.	Sing I'm a Little Tea Pot with your child. Leave out words in the song & encourage your child to fill in the blank. For example sing, "I'm a little tea pot short & stout, here is my handle & here is my ____".	Talk about clovers with your child. Describe them & talk about their color. Talk about where you find them (outside). Take your child outside to show him/her what they look like.	Count out 10 coins with your child. Line up the coins and let your child point as you count them aloud. Allow him/her to count with you or after you. Make a rainbow with your child. Talk about the different colors. Where do you see them (in the sky)? When do you see them (after it rains)? Encourage your child to identify and/or name the colors you say.	Read a Book Can you name 5 pictures in the book? Describe a kite (color, shape, size). What do you do with a kite? Where do you fly a kite? When do you fly a kite? Is it fun to play with a kite? Do you like kites?	Read a story. Tell what happened in the beginning, middle and end.
Play a game as a family. (ex. Go Fish, Simon Says).	Talk about smells with your child. Let him/her smell various things like coffee beans, lunch/dinner cooking, flowers, etc. Describe the smells. Does it smell good or bad?	Compare/Contrast How are a rainbow and a cloud alike? How are they different? How are a lion and a lamb alike? How are they different?	Read a Book Can you name 5 pictures in the book?	Draw a rainbow. Can you name or identify the colors you drew?
