LITERATURE	Robinson Crusoe: Quiz #7 and the Robinson Crusoe Final Quiz over all chapters will be posted this week. By now you should be finished with your reading of Robinson Crusoe! Complete the quizzes by the end of the week!
ART	Graduation boards – you now should have the letters for your name to put on your board. I've included two sets your name (many often do a shadowing effect by placing one color on top of and offset the contrasting color. This is optional.
MATH	Watch the video for Lesson 101 found in Mrs. Splitt's Google Classroom in the Classwork – Math section. Complete #1-15.
WORLD History	Continue working on Google Slides project. If you didn't do the Rome and Christianity Test, do that to turn in next Monday.
ENGLISH	Complete Chapter 24 Test. You can use book and composition book. Turn in next Monday.

MUSIC	 Decide if you want to sing, sign language, or play an instrument. Pick a song: Anything Christian or Positive will be acceptable (Mrs. Arehart has final say).
