Sign Up and Fee Deadline is May 20

For quick sign up: Call, text, or email Mr. Cooper (contact info is below) Registration and fee is still required to begin class.

Student must be 14 years of age by June 1st to join.

Student will need access to internet connection for online portion.

\$125 per student (Must pay before student can start the online class)

Send payment using E-Funds Student Account to South Prairie High School. You can also pay by mail.

Once the student has paid and packet info is received, student will be provided a link to sign up and begin the online course.

Class Includes:

1.) Online Instruction Course (30 hours)

- As soon as payment is received, Mr. Cooper will provide website link and students can work at their own pace.
- Online portion must be completed before student can do driving portion.

2.) Behind the Wheel Training (6 hours)

- Mr. Cooper will provide in car instruction in the surrounding Minot area.

Driver Education Requirements:

- A. Students **Must be entering 9th-12th grade** in the fall of 2020.
- B. Students **must be age 14 by June 1st) in order to be eligible for class.** Unless Mr. Cooper gives permission under special circumstances.
- C. **Cost is \$125** for first time students. Students who sign up to take driver education because of loss of license will have to pay full tuition. The cost of these students will be \$400.00. Payments is due before class begins, along with registration and proof of date of birth. **Deadline is May 20th.**
- D. Parents can use the online **E-funds student account** to pay the class fee.
- E. Driver's permit is recommended, but not required.
- F. Each student **must be 14** in order to participate in the behind the wheel portion of the class. A copy of the student's birth certificate of Driver's permit verifying age must be submitted with the registration.

Additional Permit and License Information

The North Dakota legislature passed a minor licensing law for individual under the age of 18 in 1999.

Any person who is at least 14 years old may apply for an instruction permit. Applicants must pass a vision test and a test of rules of the road and traffic signs. The booklet for studying for this test may be picked up at any local Department of Transportation. Testing will also take place at the same local sites. The nearest sites would be in town in Minot.

Students must have a copy of their birth certificate and social security card when appearing for the test. Instruction permits are valid for one year and may be renewed.

The permittee must be accompanied by a licensed driver at least 18 years of age, who has had at least three years of driving experience. An individual other than the supervising driver and permit holder may not be in the front seat unless the vehicle has only a front seat (like a pick up), in which case the supervising driver must be seated next to the permit holder.

Ages 14-15, the instruction permit must be held for 12 months prior to attempting the road test for an operator's license. If under the age of 16, a driver education course must also be completed prior to road test. Road tests must be scheduled with the testing agency. Ages 16-17 must hold a valid learner's permit for at least 6 months. Completion of driver education course not required. Must complete a road test through the state to be issued a license. 18 years and older only needs to complete a road test through the state to be issued a license.

Upon successful completion of the road test, a restricted license will be issued. Anyone under the age of 16 is restricted to parent or legal guardian's vehicles; or to vehicles equipped with dual controls. Anyone under the age of 16 cannot carry more passengers than the vehicle manufacturer's suggested passenger capacity.

The director shall cancel the permit or license of a minor under the age of 18 who accumulated six or more points on their driving record or commits an alcohol-related offense while operating a motor vehicle. Any person under the age of 21 is presumed under the influence if the BAC is .02% or higher.

A minor, under 18, whose permit or license has been cancelled in this manner will be considered as never having a permit or license before. An instruction permit will be issued after successful completion of another driver education course and the required six months holding period of the permit.
