Be sure you have reviewed all information included before emailing. You may NOT register for a class that is BLACKED-OUT on the schedule.

Important information regarding the schedule:

- ALL COURSES ARE SEMESTER LONG CLASSES. You will need to select a FIRST SEMESTER COURSE and SECOND SEMESTER COURSE for EACH PERIOD! You may mix and match courses, like if you wanted to take 5th period Folk Art first semester and then Street Law second semester, that is fine! Just be sure you have all of your requirements and you have a class each semester each period.
- Most Courses are 0.500 credits per SEMESTER. 1 credit equals one YEAR. (PE is 0.250 credits per semester. You need 0.500 credits of PE for GRADUATION).
- If you are a senior—you may leave AFTER 5th period only if you are part of the CIP program—to qualify for this, you must have a job or volunteer after school and you must be able to PROVE that employment/volunteer work. Also, grades may prevent you from participating in this program. Even if you are able to do it first semester, the school may change your status in the CIP program at the second semester if you do not meet qualifications.
- Juniors, you may leave after 7th period ONLY if you are participating in a volunteer program. You must show evidence of volunteering. Your status may be revoked if necessary after first semester.
- If you are taking CCP, you can take as many classes on our class as you want, but typically, students stay 1-5 periods and take CCP classes after that. The majority of CCP classes on the college campus begin at 12:30. That would allow time to get to the college after 5th period (ends at 11:55). To be eligible for athletics, you will need a combination of at least 5 classes.
- Many classes are SEQUENTIAL—if you did not take the first year of the course, you cannot register for the next classes (Spanish, for example, must be taken Spanish 1, Spanish 2, Spanish 3) You cannot take out of order.
- We are not accepting requests for teacher's aides this year. There are several NEW course options, so sign up for a class. Any blanks on your schedule will be filled in by Mrs. Greco or Mr. Wallace.
- High School BAND is 3rd period—if you want to participate in band, you must sign up for that class during that period.
- ALL STUDENTS ON AN IEP will need to take RESOURCE room either 2nd (if a 9th grader), 3rd or 4th period. This is required by the intervention specialists.
- AFNR is the INTRODUCTION TO AG class for FFA. If you are interested in taking any AG classes throughout high school, you must first take AFNR.
- Classes that are labeled "SSCC" are Southern State Community College courses. In order to register for those classes, you MUST have an INTENT TO PARTICIPATE form on file with Mrs. Greco, and you must apply and be accepted to Southern State Community College. If you register for that class, but are not accepted or you do not place into the class based on your ACCUPLACER test, you will not be allowed to take that class.

- The class labeled UT/Peak is a combination class—UT is University of Toledo (you must apply and be accepted by University of Toledo), and PEAK is A+ Credit recovery—you will only be placed in PEAK if you Fail a class first semester and require credit recovery. You may only register for Peak first semester if you failed a class first or second semester during the 2020 school year!
- Culinary 1 and Culinary 2 are new COOKING Classes offered by Mrs. Bryan in the Family Consumer Science Classroom.
- CCR/Personal Finance are SENIOR ONLY Classes—all seniors MUST register for this class (or have taken an equivalent at college).
- Any of Mr. Call's Courses count toward the "technology" requirement for graduation. You need ONE CREDIT of TECHNOLOGY for graduation.
- Any of Mrs. St. Clair or Mrs. Sawyer's classes will count toward your FINE ART Requirement for graduation. You need ONE CREDIT of FINE ART for graduation. (2 semesters)
- Art Portfolio is by invitation only—do not register for that class unless you received that invitation from Mrs. Sawyers.
- There are several new course selections. Please contact teacher listed if you need further explanation of a course.
- If you would like to take Mrs. Smith's 6th period course, please indicate whether you would like to take Environmental or Human Anatomy.
- Please only sign up for Cross Categorical "Mentor" if you want to be a mentor for Mrs. Heather Strong's Cross-Categorical courses. Typically you are required to submit an application for this position. You will be helping in her class with her students as needed—She has the right to deny any requests to be mentor.
- If you are planning to take CCP classes on a college campus, you must contact the college. You will need to APPLY, I will send transcripts when requested by the school, and then the school will contact you to create your CCP schedule.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Board of Education desires that its standards for graduation meet the minimum standards of the Ohio Department of Education and further that our high school will compare favorably with high schools in the state recognized for their excellence. The minimum requirements for graduation from high school are as follows: Due to the new course requirements beginning with the Class of 2006, students will need to look at their long-range plans before choosing course requests and be advised of the following:

Requirements for Graduation

- ☐ English 4 credits
 - ☐ Math-Must include one unit of Algebra II or Higher 4 Credits
 - ☐ Science 3 Credits (Must include the following)
 - ☐ 1 Life Science –Biological (Biology 10th grade year)
 - ☐ 1 Physical Science (Physical Science 9th grade year)
 - ☐ 1 Advanced Science (Chemistry, Physics, Human Anatomy, Environmental Science, or 2 Advanced Ag Classes)
 - ☐ Social Studies 3 Credits (must have the following)
 - ☐ World History (ANY GRADES MAY TAKE)
 - ☐ U.S. History (10th grade year)
 - ☐ Government (Typically taken 9th or 11th grade year)
 - ☐ Any of the “elective” courses will count as the credits.
 - ☐ Business Technology 1 credit
 - ☐ Fine Art 1 credit
 - ☐ Health ½ credit (1 semester, typically 9th or 10th grade year)
 - ☐ Phys. Ed. (two Semesters) ½ Credit (typically taken during 9th and 10th grade year) **Can be exempted if playing sports**
 - ☐ Financial Literacy-Taken Senior Year 1 credit (CCR and Personal Finance Senior year)
 - ☐ Elective Credits 3
