REQUIREMENTS FOR SUNRAY COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS

1. Applicant must have attended Sunray High School and lived with Sunray Independent School District for at least **two years** inclusive of their senior year.
2. Applicant must be a **citizen** of the U.S.A. and have a **valid** Social Security #.
3. Applicant must complete application form and return it by **12PM – May 15th, 2020**.
4. Recipient is not limited to attend college or university. He may attend a trade school, vocational school, etc.
5. **Recipient must take a minimum of 12 hours per fall and spring semesters.**
6. If the recipient of the scholarship does not enroll in college the year he graduates, he must enroll the following spring semester or **forfeit the scholarship**, to the next recipient in line.
7. Scholarship money must be used to cover the following expenses: tuition, fees, books, room and board, or supplies. To assure that the money is being used for these expenses, **it will be issued through the Financial Aide Office at the student's chosen school.**
8. The scholarship money of **\$1200** will be divided and given in **two disbursements**. \$600.00 will be given each semester the student is enrolled. If the student does not enroll in school the second semester, the money will be retained in the scholarship fund.
9. Upon the completion of the first semester, the **recipient must provide documentation of at least a 2.0 GPA**. If this criteria is not met, then he will have a probationary period of one semester to improve their GPA so the second \$600.00 payment would be available to them at the beginning of the next semester.

Considerations in choosing a recipient include:

1. Does the applicant possess the ability and determination necessary to obtain further education?
2. What impact might college have on his life? (self-reliance, decision making; broader understanding; ability to achieve within our society, etc.)
3. Does the applicant have a deep and sincere desire to further his education?
4. Might further education enhance earning ability? If less than a full degree is obtained?
5. Is he willing to work part-time to help with expenses?
6. Is financial assistance available from other sources? (family, other scholarships, etc.)
7. Is this scholarship necessary to enable them to attend college or trade school?
