5. Principal's Reports.

Mrs. Mathes reported that FHS cheer tryouts for 2020-2021 will be held virtually. FHS graduation for the 2020 seniors will be held July 19, 2020 at 4 p.m. Eighth grade promotion videos will be posted on Facebook and our website. FHS Summer school will be held in person July 6th through the 30th. Mr. SanRomani reported that the supply return dates will be May 20th and 21st. Elementary awards are still proceeding virtually. KRR summer school will be from May 26th through June 19th and will be virtual.

6. Superintendent's Update:

a. <u>Summer School.</u> Summer proposal included in the packet. This plan gives dates that comply with the Governor's opening phases, KSHSAA, and guidelines from Reno County.

Jim Combs and Eric Kennedy approved the summer proposal. Motion carried 7-0.

- b. <u>CARES Funding</u>. Fairfield will be receiving a grant from the CARES Act in the amount of \$63,212.00. This money will help cover costs related to COVID-19.
- c. <u>Financial Outlook for 2020-2021</u>. Randy Ford will be coming on May 14th to discuss the financial outlook for the next school year. Mrs. McKinney has a list of ideas of ways to cut costs for 2020-2021.
- d. <u>Food Delivery</u>, <u>April 29th.</u> Reno County and United Way of Reno County donated enough food for fifty-five families in the district. The food was delivered by staff members of the school. Mrs. McKinney also discussed several other programs directed towards helping families with food expenses.
- e. <u>Math Curriculum</u>. The math curriculum that is currently used for elementary is based on the old standards. Mr. SanRomani received four different samples of curriculum and is recommending the Eureka curriculum. The cost for three years is \$11,265.27 which includes K through 6 teacher editions, student workbooks and a digital suite. After the three years have ended, the only cost would be for the digital suite and student workbooks. Brent Fowler and Seth Beck moved and seconded the Eureka curriculum. Motion carried 7-0.

7. Capital Outlay Projects.

a. <u>Track</u>. The scoreboard will be installed May 18th. APAC plans to start the milling process May 25th. After that, the asphalt must cure for 28 days. Beynon will start the laying the track in early July, weather permitting b. <u>Bus Purchase/Grant</u>. Tyler Eash, Transportation Director presented bids to the BOE. His recommendation was the 2019 Chevy Collins bus that is a 33 passenger with zero miles. The cost is \$58,450. The DERA grant will cover \$15,000 of purchase price.

Seth Beck and Eric Kennedy moved and seconded the approval of the 2019 Chevy Collins bus for \$58,450. Motion carried 7-0.

8. Committee Report(s):

a. <u>RCEC (Steve Westfahl).</u> Girard Medical Center was approved to help assist with processing Medicaid claims. The online speech therapy program was approved. They are short five speech therapists currently. They also authorized the hiring of a teacher for the infant and toddler program.
