school?

Lunch/Recess - 25/25

- Middle school kids are learning to socialize as adolescents. They need to try out various roles, and school is a safe environment.
- They need autonomy to learn to use unstructured time well.
- They are growing at different rates and are at various levels of development physically, mentally, and emotionally. They need to be able to try out their skills and their muscles and use their energy.
- The students get to relate to adults in informal settings.



- Miscoe Hill uses the same system that Clough and Memorial uses, a card swipe or ID entry system that can be accessed by parents.
- Lunch and recess will be 25 minutes each
- Our motto is "When in doubt, we're going out!" Real feel 20 degrees or above and no precipitation means outdoor recess.

Required screenings for 5th grade are scoliosis and vision.

• All prescription medications must have a signed order by a physician or nurse practitioner. Students may have Tums, Tylenol or Ibuprofen with parent's permission. Students may not carry medicine into school and all medication must be kept in the nurse's office.




