Rebecca Hutchinson named Superintendent of Concord Community Schools



Rebecca Hutchinson has been chosen to serve as the next superintendent for Concord Community Schools. Hutchinson was announced as the incoming superintendent following a unanimous vote of the Concord School Board on Monday, May 18.

Hutchinson began her career in Education as a 5th grade teacher in Reed City, MI back in 2001. In 2008, she was hired to teach Science at Concord Middle School where she served for 8 years prior to becoming the principal of Concord Elementary and Middle School in 2016. In addition to her teacher responsibilities, Mrs. Hutchinson also served as the middle school robotics coach.
