JOB TITLE: MIDDLE SCHOOL COUNSELOR

REPORTS TO: Supervisor of Guidance/Building Principal/Supervisor of Intervention Services

JOB GOAL:

To provide counseling services to students in grades 6-8 that will assist them in resolving personal, emotional, behavioral and social problems that might interfere with their adjustment to school and their capacity to enjoy the fullest benefit of the education offered them.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Certifications as Student Personnel/School Counselor.
- 2. Experience as determined to be appropriate by the Board of Education
- 3. Broad knowledge of testing and evaluation, theories of individual and group guidance techniques and elementary or middle school guidance program design.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to communicate and work effectively with students, parents, staff and community groups and organizations.
- 5. Maintains current and appropriate resources for education stakeholders.
- 6. Demonstrate the ability to listen well to children and to adults who work with children and adults who work with children.
- 7. Uses data to develop comprehensive programs that meet student needs.
- 8. Assists teachers, parents/guardians, and other stakeholders in interpreting and understanding student data.
- 9. Demonstrates knowledge and incorporates technology in daily tasks, as required.
- 10. Required criminal history check and proof of U.S. citizenship or legal resident alien status.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES AND KEY DUTIES:

- 1. To provide emergency and on-going counseling services to students affected by crises such as death, divorce, illness, and societal concerns as needed. Assists in the resolution of school related problems.
- 2. Assists students, both groups and individual, in understanding the school and orients them to school procedures as needed.
- 3. Works with school staff, R T I/I & R S Committee, Section 504 Committee and Child Study Teams to implement a comprehensive development course of study designed to meet the individual needs, interests, and abilities of designated students.
- 4. Assists in the identification of students with special needs and works with staff to implement programs to cope with students' educational and behavioral disabilities.
- 5. Confers with parents, staff to help them better understand programs designed to assist the educational, vocational, personal, behavior and social

adjustments of their child/student.

- 6. Initiates, assembles, maintains, and interprets all records for designated students and assists staff with understanding and maintaining the same.
- 7. Obtains and disseminates age appropriate occupational information to classes studying career choices.
- 8. Organizes and conducts group guidance activities as needed in the areas of educational, social, and self-awareness.
- 9. Provide for a smooth transition from middle to high school.
- Attends faculty meetings, serves on committees, performs the same student supervision duties as assigned to teachers to ensure a safe environment for students.
- 11. Remains abreast of current developments, new trends and contemporary interpretations of student personnel services and serves as a resource to the parents/staff of assigned schools and the District.
- 12. Conducts student/staff workshops to promote adjustments to student concerns such as home and family relationships, health and emotional situations as needed.
- 13. Cooperates with Child Study Teams, DYFS, and police as requested to deal with problems/concerns of individual or groups of students.
- 14. Participates in the organization and administration of school testing programs and assists in interpreting test results to parents, pupils and teachers
- 15. Meets with teachers individually concerning student needs, programs, testing, etc.
- 16. Disseminates materials of an occupational and career education nature for pupil, parent and staff use.
- 17. Provides guidance activity input to Supervisors/Administrators.
- 18. Provides budget input to Supervisor/Administrator as requested or assigned.
- 19. Provides RTI Team Meeting reports to the Supervisor of Intervention.
- 20. Participates in in-service education for all personnel as required.
- 21. Performs all other duties assigned by the Superintendent or his designee consistent with law, contract, policies, and regulations.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Salary and work year to be consistent with the terms established by the Agreement between the Board of Education and the Old Bridge Education Association.

Persons with mental or physical disabilities are eligible as long as they can perform the essential functions of the job after reasonable accommodation is made to their known limitations. If the accommodation cannot be made because it would cause the employer undue hardship, such person may not be eligible.

EVALUATION:

Performance of this job will be evaluated annually by the Supervisor of Guidance in accordance with state law and the provisions of the board's policy on evaluation of certified staff.

Sterling High School "Doing Business As (DBA)" SJTP Shared Service Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT made this <u>16</u> day of <u>August</u>, **2016** between the BOARD OF EDUCATION of **STERLING HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT "DBA" SJTP**, Somerdale, New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as "STERLING", and the <u>Old Bridge Township Public Schools</u>, in <u>Matawan, New Jersey</u> (hereinafter referred to as "SHARED SERVICE DISTRICT").

WITNESSETH:

Word\SJTP Master Service Agreement -

- A. N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1et seq. and 18A:18A-1, as appropriate, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation authorizes SHARED SERVICES by educational and municipal districts.
- B. STERLING and SHARED SERVICES DISTRICT are participating.
- C. SHARED SERVICES DISTRICT wishes to join with STERLING to share services. Service may include, but not limited to Business Office Services, Technology Support, Electrical, Curriculum Services, AHERA Services, HVAC, Plumbing, Custodial, Construction Management, Maintenance Services and Supplies and Materials.
- D. STERLING doing business as (DBA) South Jersey Technology Partnership (SJTP) has developed a partnership to deliver technology and other shared services.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. STERLING and SHARED SERVICES DISTRICT shall from time to time purchase above products and services.
- 2. STERLING will be responsible for hiring certified and competent employees and all materials to complete the task.
- 3. The employees will be paid by STERLING.
- 4. STERLING will have the right to hire employees to work for the SHARED SERVICE DISTRICT.
- 5. SHARED SERVICE DISTRICT authorizes STERLING (SJTP) to write bid specifications, review bids that are received and submit the qualified bidder as required per NJSA 18A-1 et. seq. bid law.
- 6. SHARED SERVICE DISTRICT shall have the right to participate with any task or service.
- 7. SHARED SERVICE DISTRICT shall pay STERLING HIGH SCHOOL (SJTP) directly for those items or services (or portions thereof) which they purchase
- 8. Should this agreement be terminated by either party the shared service district agrees not to employ a current/previous SJTP employee for a period of one (1) year.
- 9. As per N.J.S.A., the term of this agreement shall be five (5) years. Either party may cancel with a thirty (30) day written notice
