Frequently Asked Questions for June Childcare Services

What services will be provided for the month of June?

Childcare services will be limited to on campus activities. Outdoor & indoor play activities will be scheduled.

May I bring my child's lunch, toys, food or other supplies with them for the day?

To minimize any cross contamination, food from home and personal belongings are prohibited during this time, including toys and water bottles. Water will be provided onsite.

Will my child be able to wear a mask?

Students and staff are allowed to wear a mask if desired.

How will recess and meal times work?

Teachers will adjust schedules to limit activities to smaller groups and allow for spaces to be disinfected.

How will the facility be cleaned?

The district will follow CDC's guidance for clearning and disinfecting district facilities.

Will guest or parents be permitted to enter the building during pick-up and drop-off?

Guests and parents will not be permitted in the building during this time. Parents and students will be met outside of the SACC/Preschool entrance. Once a parent has arrived to pick-up their child, the parent will call the SACC/Preschool office. A staff member will walk the student out to meet their parent.

Will my child be screened before enter the building?

Arriving parents will call the SACC/Preschool office for a staff member to meet the family outside to conduct a health screening prior to the student entering the school facility. The teacher will ask a few health screening questions along with taking the student's temperature. Students will sanitize their hands prior to entering the building.

What is the ratio of students to teacher during the month of June?

Ten students or less will be assigned to one teacher.

Will my sibling children be assigned to the same classroom?

Parents may request their K-6 grade children be in the same classroom.

What if my child presents a fever while at school?

A child that presents a fever will be isolated from other children. The child may not be able to return for 72 hours after being fever free without the use of fever-reducing medications.
