- A thank you was read by President Olson from Linnae Slattery thanking them for their support of the staff. He also reported that he would be having a zoom meeting with 3-Rivers Cooperative on May 20, and Scott has bills in June.
- Superintendent Halverson reported the planning is beginning for next school year, surveys for parents/students is on the website, staff surveys have gone out for information gathering; developing a distance learning plan; we still have an Ag. Education Instructor, Audio Visual Instructor, and MS/HS Counselor openings; the custodians are ahead on the summer schedule; advisors are looking at alternatives for prom and graduation will be at a later date.
- Middle School Principal/AD Pierson reported that teachers are finishing up grades and working on check out lists; many conversations have been held about what worked and what we can do to improve on after this process is through; the staff deserves a great deal of credit during this last quarter. They are planning for weight room and open gym distancing guidelines; the State is going to offer some guidance for contact rules soon so we can nail down summer plans.
- High School Principal Redden reported the packets have been turned in and bags from the student lockers are left for students to pick up; the athletic and academic awards will be published in the newspaper next week; Spirit Week had numerous pictures contributed, Stadium Lights for Seniors had lots of participation, a Huge Thank You to Carrie Larson and Jeri Ann Lyon for all they put into organizing

Wave Parade for the graduates; Thank you to all First Responders for their contribution to the celebrations! A tentative social distancing parade on Main Street for Prom with ideas still being brought forward for this event.

- Elementary Principal Kuxhaus reported that food service has averaged about 770 sack breakfasts and lunches per week; staff are preparing for end of year checkout and planning for next year-completing Title, Technology and MGS End of Year survey, which includes questions on Flex Learning. The End of Year review is planned for Thursday. There is a Pre-Kindergarten-Kindergarten survey on the website.
