

End of the Year Health Report:

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Overview

The 2019-2020 School Nurse End of Year Report includes data collected from each building in the district with the purpose of providing a cumulative picture of school nursing services.

Illness/Injuries:

In the Elementary, a total of 123 students were sent home throughout the year due to sickness (fever, vomiting, diarrhea, etc.) and a total of 32 were sent home in high school. (These were seen in my office and sent home)

A total of 7 students in elementary were sent for medical attention and 7 students in high school. (Including 3 fracture injuries)

Summary of Services:

1. E-school is used to maintain confidential health records as well as individual student health folders in the Nurse's office.
2. Services are provided for students with Special Health Care Needs.
3. Promote compliance with Arkansas Immunization Requirements and provide communicable disease control.
4. Emergency Nursing Services plans developed and implemented in the schools, including staff training and delegation when needed, medication administration, referral and follow-up.
5. Participate in Vision, Hearing, Scoliosis and BMI screening process and follow-up.
6. Provide health education for students, families and staff to promote healthy lifestyles and responsible decision-making regarding matters affecting health and wellness.

Immunizations:

There were a total of 13 students with immunization exemptions.

There were no significant communicable disease outbreaks during this school year.

The total number of Flu Shots given on campus this year: 163.

Teaching:

Teaching provided to students this year included-

1. Smile Smart (Dr. Tipton): Teaching on brushing, flossing, plaque, etc. Toothbrush kits handed out. (Preschool-4th)
2. Hall/Koppel Orthodontics: Teaching on brushing, flossing and braces care. (2nd and 3rd grade)
3. Vaping/Juuling Presentation: Presented to High school 7-12th grades.

Screenings:

303 students were screened for vision, with 25 being referred to eye doctor.

303 students were screened for hearing, with 29 being referred to a physician.

187 students were screened for BMI. (8th and 10th were not screened this year due to Covid-19)

34 students were screened for Scoliosis. (8th grade was not screened this year due to Covid-19)

Chronic Medical Conditions:

When a student has a chronic medical condition, a care plan is created and kept in their medical folder in the nurse's office. Also, any information the student's teacher may need to know such as signs/symptoms to look for and what should be done, is provided. If classroom modifications are needed, I can sit in on 504 meetings to get those modifications implemented into the student's plan.

Healthy Active Arkansas:

We were awarded a bottle filling station in August 2019 for our elementary through a grant. I applied for another filling station and just received word we are being awarded a 2nd bottle filling station, that will most likely go in our MPB.
