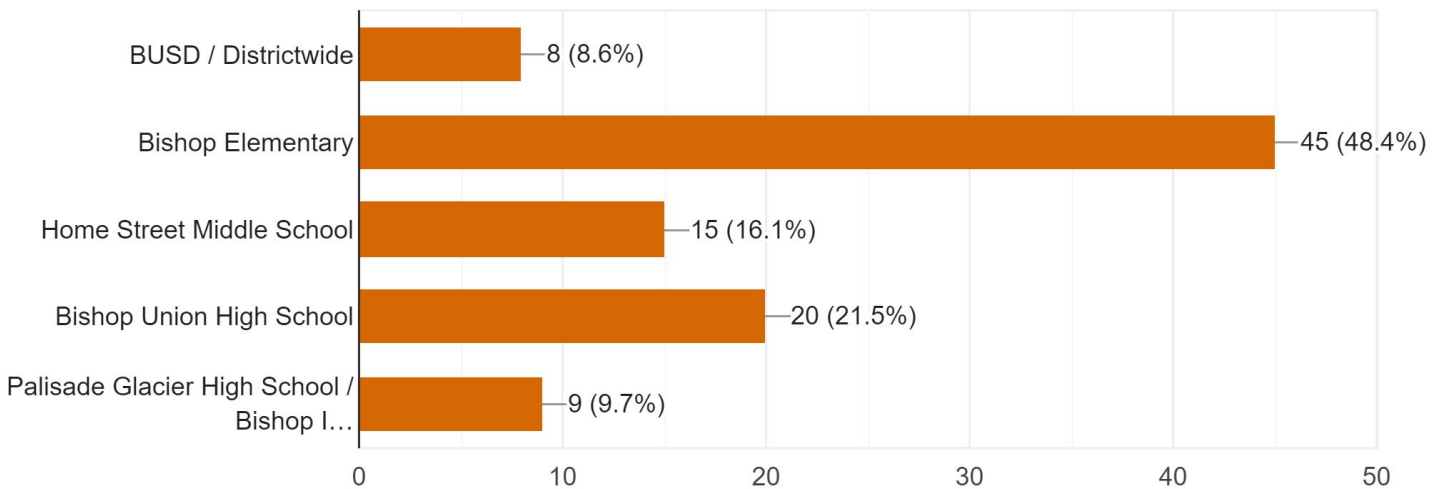

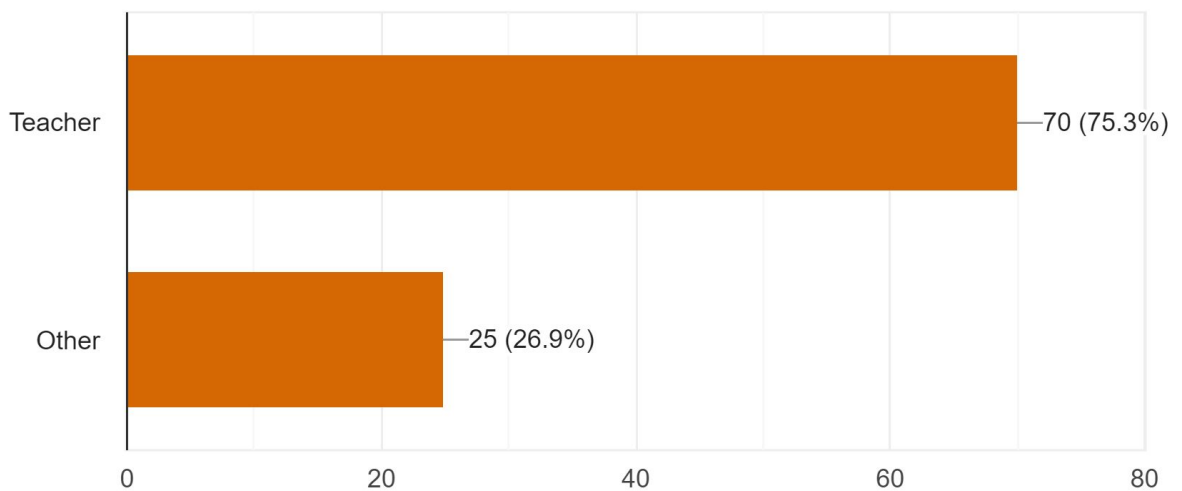

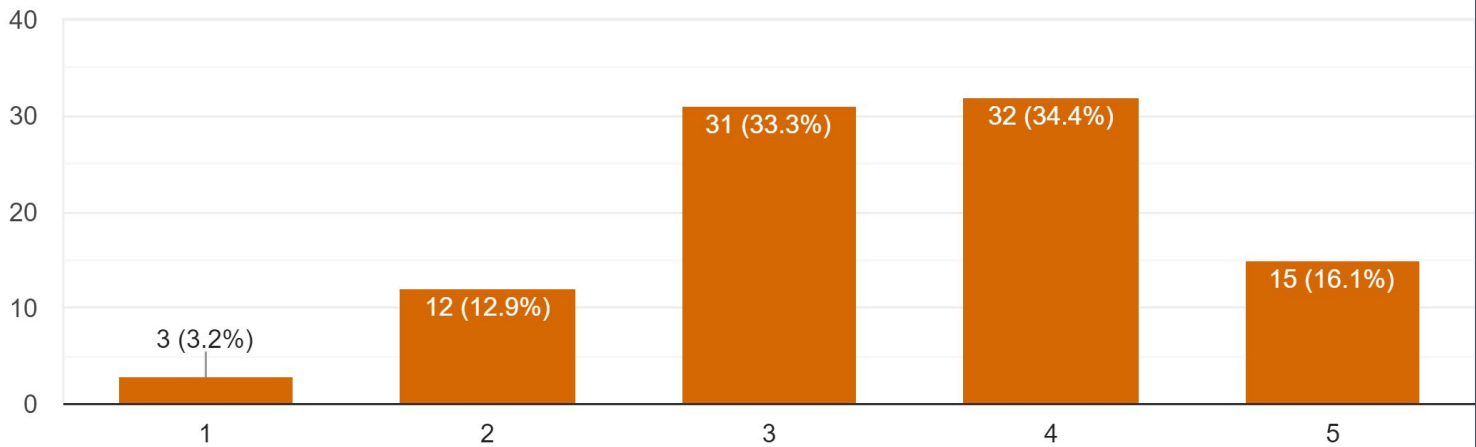

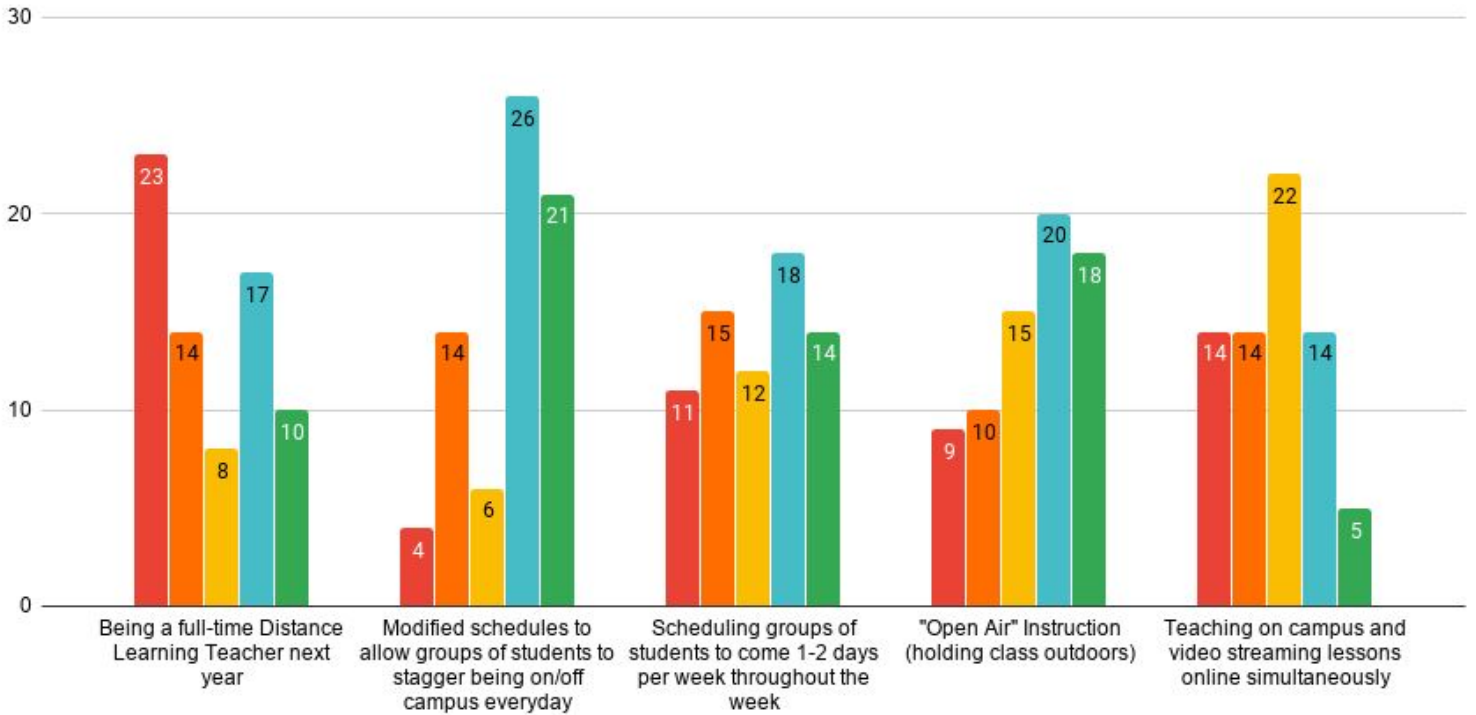

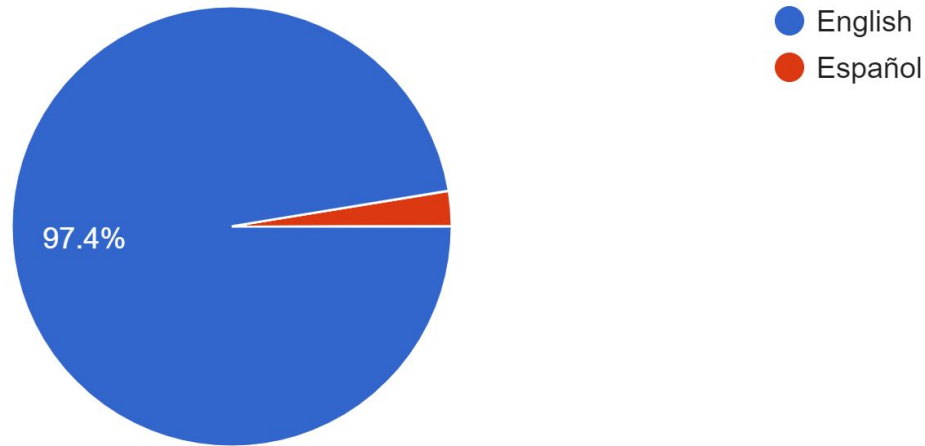

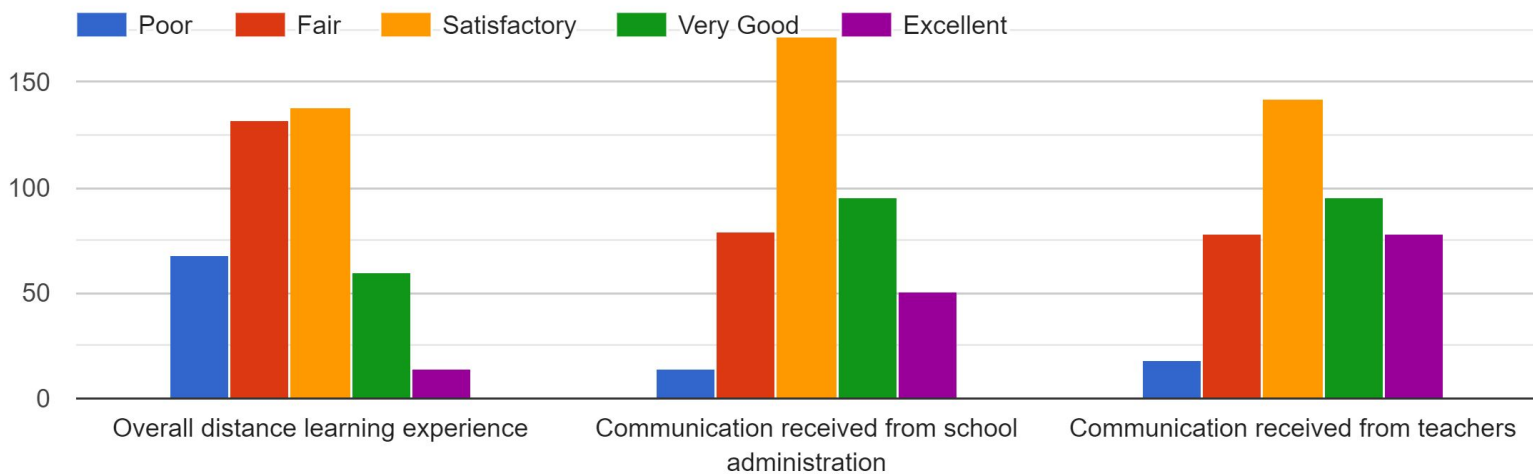

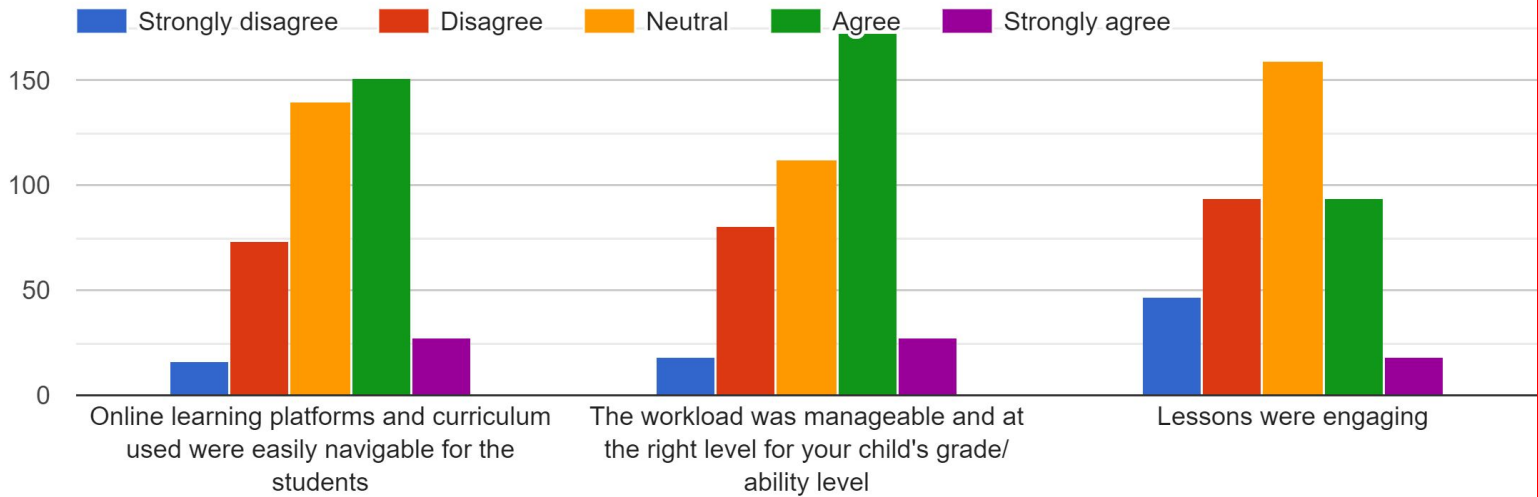

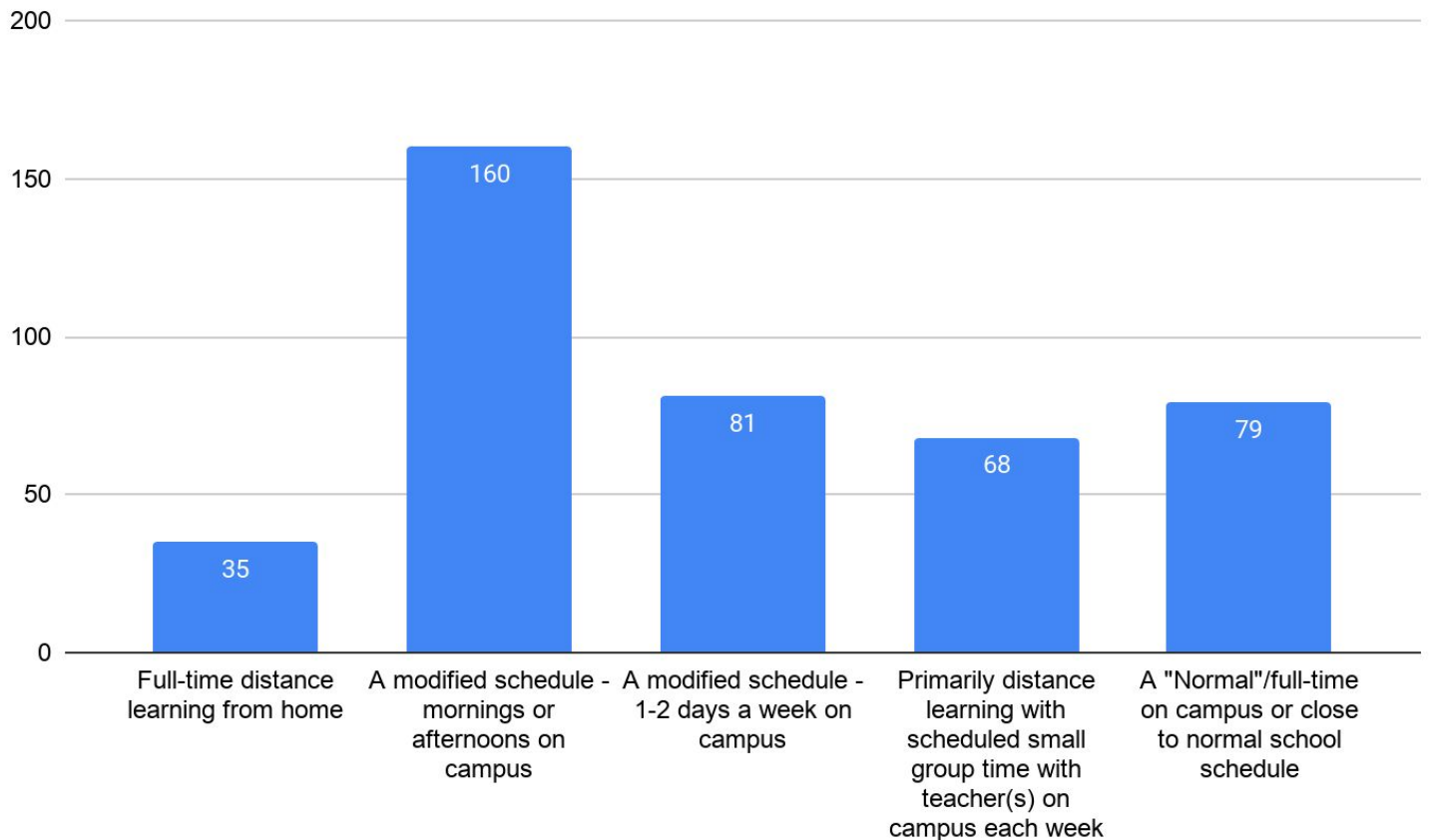
Using the scale below, please rate your level of agreement/disagreement with the following:



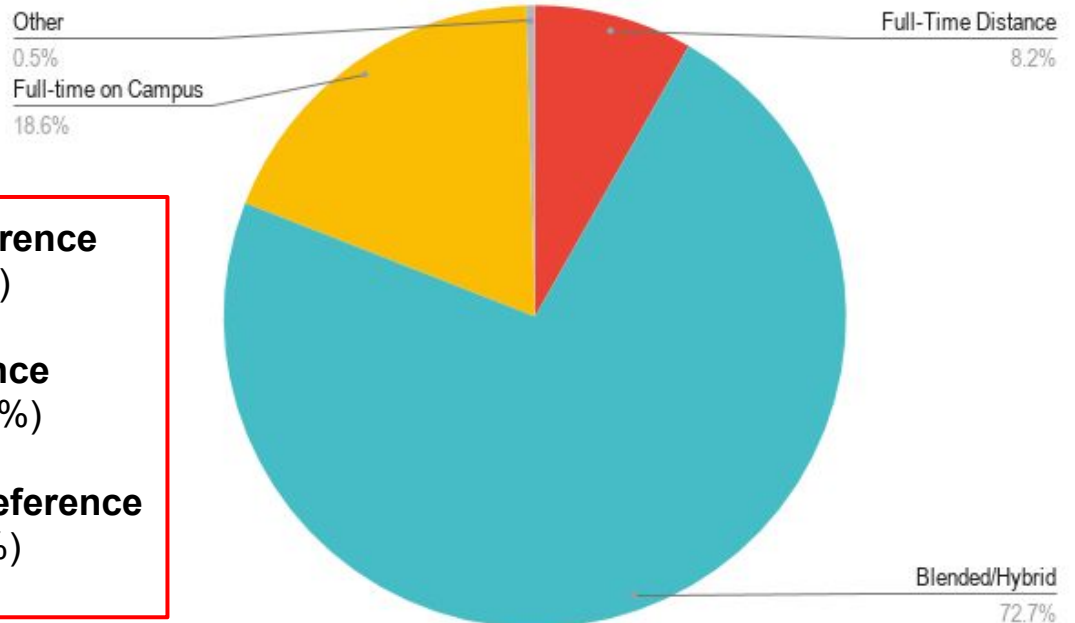

BUSD Reopening Planning

May 21, 2020

- Reopening Committee being established
- Regular guidance, communication, and updates from:
 - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (**CDC**)
 - California Department of Education (**CDE**)
 - Department of Public Health
 - Inyo County Office of Education (**ICOE**) with collaboration from neighboring school districts in Inyo County
 - Local, state, and federal government
 - School staff, including the teachers & classified unions
 - Our Community
- School reopening is ultimately a district-level / board-level decision, within the general parameters given by the government and department of public health
- Colleges nationwide have been moving towards an online model for Fall 2020. Public schools, and our community, have a strong voice in that we want to do all we can to get students safely back on campuses.
- Moving forward with in-seat summer session for some students K-12 (July 20 - August 7)
- Plans are needed now, but also need to be flexible as circumstances change quickly and we need to be able to adapt
