2022-2023 Prescott School District Board Goals

- $\bullet$  Prescott School District will improve our average passing scores on the state SBAC assessment in all areas (ELA, Math and Science; based on spring 2022 SBAC scores) by a minimum of 20% -
- o a. ELA from 28.2% to at least 33.8%
- o b. Math from 20.5% to at least 24.6%
- o c. Science from 27.1% to at least 32.5%
- Prescott School District will emphasize the social-emotional growth of students and staff, in addition to academic growth, improving positive relationships between students and staff, students and each other, staff and each other, and the school district and the community; this will be achieved through the implementation of both the Character Strong SEL curriculum and RULER training for emotional intelligence.
- Prescott School District will encourage and support student voice and leadership through the Associated Student Body, improving the ability of current students to advocate for their educational and emotional needs utilizing effective and active self-governance strategies and staff guidance. This includes expanding the activities of both our HS and MS ASB programs and the addition of class advisors for all grades from 6-12, with new responsibilities (supporting class meetings, class fundraising activities and class community service projects).
- By June of 2023, Prescott School District, to improve equitable representation of all community stakeholders and provide for more diverse leadership will have successfully revised the Director Districts using 2020 census data, Sammamish Systems assistance, and guidance from the Walla Walla County District Attorney and the Walla Walla County Assessor's Office, to include 3 Director Districts with 2 At-large Director positions.
