As a school administrator, I want you to know that I have not received guidelines from CDC or DOE on how to reopen Maine schools in the fall. We have received guidance on summer school programming and are currently working on a plan for what those options will be. I'm looking at social media posts and the comments from folks who are stressed and fearful about what school will look like in the fall. I'm hopeful that we can all pause and think rationally for just a moment. A lot is changing each week in our state and country. It's May 22nd and the first day of school is scheduled for September 2nd. A lot can and will change over the next three months, before we open our doors back up to students. What I can promise you is that we will be ready to keep our students safe, loved, and educated. We will rise to any challenge and make the absolute best of it. We will prioritize physical AND emotional wellness. It is too soon to make hard and fast decisions for what three months down the road will look like in our school. I'm asking you to help us and your children by taking a deep breath and trusting that those of us making the decisions on what this fall will look like at BRES, want exactly what you do- as close to "normal" as possible.

On June 5th we will plan on sending end of the year summaries home via email or the postal service (depending on the team). On June 8th, 9th, and 10th we will be having a drive up drop off/ pick up for materials. We need <u>all</u> library, school materials, and iPads back at BRES by June 10th. More information will be given on how this process will work.

I hope that you are all able to enjoy some time together on this long weekend. It's a great chance to recharge and gear up to finish this year strong. It's hard to believe that we are heading into the home stretch. As we think about what this long weekend means; Memorial Day commemorates the men and women who died while in the military serving their country. 
