Single Stream Recycling: All recyclables can be mixed together.

Do not put recyclables in plastic bags!

Call your Public Works Department if you need more recycling buckets (Hopewell Township: 609 537-0250, Hopewell Borough: 609 466-0168, Pennington Borough: 609 737-9440).

Accepted Materials in Curbside Recycling Bucket

- Mixed paper, window envelopes
- Corrugated cardboard (flatten boxes)
- Phone books and soft cover books
- Hard cover books (remove hard cover and put cover in trash)
- Glass, food and beverage jars/bottles (all colors)
- Aluminum and metal beverage containers, pet food cans
- Milk jugs, plastic beverage bottles, detergent and shampoo containers
- Juice boxes and juice/beverage cartons
- Plastics with a ♻️ or ♻️ symbol.

Materials Not Accepted in Curbside Recycling Bucket

- PLASTIC BAGS and plastics with a ♻️, ♻️, ♻️, ♻️ or ♻️ symbol (but see "More Ways to Reuse or Recycle" for plastic bags and wrap, and for ♻️ plastic).
- Pizza boxes
- Light bulbs
- Aluminum foil/baking pans, bandage tins, cookie tins
- Drinking glasses, dishes and broken window glass,
- Ceramics and pottery
- Aerosol cans, motor oil and anti-freeze containers
- Clothes hangers (but see "More Ways to Reuse or Recycle")
- Carbon and waxed paper
- Tissue paper, napkins, paper plates and paper towels
- Styrofoam (but see "More Ways to Reuse or Recycle")

CFL Bulbs: MCIA Household Hazardous Waste Collection

Clothes and Shoes: Consignment stores and charities (check websites), or outdoor collection boxes. Also, all schools of the Hopewell Valley Regional School District have outdoor boxes for the collection of **clothing (clean, dry), home linens (sheets, towels, curtains, etc.), accessories (hats, purses, bags, belts, etc.), and shoes (pairs).**

Clothes Hangers: Dry cleaners may take metal hangers back for reuse. Clothing stores can reuse hangers that are left at the store.

Contact Lenses and Empty Blister Packs: drop off or mail (free shipping) bausch.com/our-company/one-by-one-recycling

Electronics: MCIA and Hopewell Township (see “Events”); Best Buy accepts a wide variety of products, check listings at bestbuy.com/recycle (fee for some products)

#5 Plastic: Rigid Containers and Caps Stamped with a ♻️ Symbol:

Preserve’s Gimme 5 Program. Drop off clean number 5 plastic at Whole Foods in Princeton, or mail it to Preserve, preserve.eco

Plastic Bags and Wrap: Stores that participate in the Trex recycling program collect the following household plastic bags and wrap: **store bags, produce bags, ziploc and other reclosable bags, bread bags, cereal box liners, case overwrap, newspaper sleeves, dry cleaning bags, ice bags, bubble wrap, and plastic mailing envelopes.** Plastic must be dry and free of food residue. Peel or cut off paper labels. Trex boxes at: Stop and Shop, Target, and more; trex.com/recycling
Plastic Plant Trays, Pots and Tags: Home Depot and Lowe’s.

Refrigerators and Freezers: njcleanenergy.com, \$50 rebate, schedule pick-up online or call 866 657-6278. Room air conditioner and/or dehumidifier can be picked up along with a fridge or freezer.

Sewing Machines: Pedals for Progress, pfp.org

Styrofoam Packing Peanuts: Take back to shipping stores for reuse, e.g., Popcorn Packers in Pennington, UPS stores, or Mail Boxes Etc.

Styrofoam Shipping Blocks: See “Events” Hopewell Valley Green Team. Shipping blocks can also be dropped off at Princeton Moulding, 76 Fourth Street, Somerville NJ. Call ahead to make sure they will be open: 908 291-1180. This facility will also accept Styrofoam food containers if they are very clean and separate from other Styrofoam.

Tires: drop off at Mavis Discount Tire, Pennington (\$1.50/tire); for curbside pick-up, check with your Public Works department.
