## Action Items:

1. Approval of previous minutes
2. Mr. Mason and administrative staff went to training to teach them the warning signs from kids who could be a threat to the school. Every school tragedy that has happened the students have given signs of issues that now we can watch for to help prevent a tragedy here. Coach Shac mentioned the benefit of having the chromebooks is being able to view the history of student's searches in identifying the threats. New House Bill 3 passed is geared more towards mental health of adolescence and children and working to change how schools handle those threats. All of this training will trickle down to staff who are on the "frontline" with the students. It was asked by Deanna Henry "What do we have in place to get students to report bullying and threats?" It was then mentioned that High school has the bulldog tipline, Jr. high has focused in core classes to be upstanders instead of bystanders. We also have the availability of the counselor for jr. high and high school and many students talk with Staci, our school nurse. It was established that we have multiple outlets for students to reach out if needed.
3. Stop the Bleed law was passed, so that schools will be more prepared incase of a fatal emergency. Training of the new teachers was completed 2/14/20 provided by our own staff who have been trained to teach the stop the bleed course.
4. Parent night of the view Screenagers was the previous Monday. No one present was sure of the turnout for parent night, but jr. high students watched it during school hours. The screening discussed the repercussions of being on a device too long. Staci

mentioned that she is beginning to see more chronic headaches from students in the clinic that she believes is due to prolonged screen time.

5. Flu update: Numbers are currently decreasing. Jr. High was hit hard in January, but attendance is back up. It was discussed that numbers have to be 10% less than the prior year for the school to shut down and it has to be across all campuses. Some students have been wearing masks during school by choice and the janitorial staff has been disinfecting daily.
