

Below is our school policy regarding cell phones and other electronic devices. We will be including Gizmos and wearable communication devices to this policy as well. Students may bring them, but they will need to be placed and remain in student backpacks upon entering the school and may be taken back out once they leave the building at the end of the day. The policy will be updated to contain current language and devices.

Students may possess a communication device which includes cellular phones and pagers while on school property. Cell phones may not be visible during a student's school day. Unauthorized use of cell phones during the school day will result in the cell phone being confiscated. Confiscated cell phones will be returned to the parent of the offender upon the request of the parent on the first offense. Subsequent violations will result in the phone being retained by the school for a minimum of two weeks. Repeated violations could result in a suspension of the offender on grounds of insubordination. Communication devices must be turned off when entering the school building. When a communication device is taken from a student, the parent or guardian will be allowed to reclaim the device from the principal's office.

We are seeing quite a bit of illness, please closely follow the illness policy stated below.

Illness Policy- we have some medically complex students at Lennox Elementary this year- please review the Illness Policy printed below, as we will be strictly enforcing our policy for the health and safety of our students.

- ❖ **Temperature of 100 F (37.8 C) or greater within the past 24 hours.** Child should remain at home until their **temperature has returned to normal for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications** such as Acetaminophen (Tylenol) or Ibuprofen (Motrin).
- ❖ **Flu like symptoms** – a fever accompanied by any one of the following: cough, runny nose, headache or sore throat. Current recommendations from the CDC are a student diagnosed with H1N1 or Seasonal Influenza may return to school when they have been **temperature free for 24 hours without the use of a fever reducing medication**.
- ❖ **Strep Throat** – child may return to school after being on antibiotic medication for **24 hours**.
- ❖ **Vomiting or Diarrhea**- child may return to school **24 hours after the last episode**.
- ❖ **Undiagnosed Rash** that may be suspicious of infectious disease. The child should be examined by a doctor before coming to school.
- ❖ **Head lice** – The child may return to school **24 hours after treatment**. The Lennox School District has a NO NIT POLICY and the child will not be allowed back into the classroom until all the nits have been removed. If you find head lice on your child at any time during the school year, please notify the school so their classmates can be checked as well.
- ❖ **Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye), Ringworm or Impetigo** – either suspected or diagnosed. Must be treated with medication for **24 hours before returning** to school. If your child has been diagnosed with viral pink eye, they may return to school when they no longer experience excessive tearing or matted eyes.
- ❖ **Scabies**- the child may return to school after treatment has been given.
- ❖ **Chickenpox**-exclude until rash or lesions have crusted over (usually 7 days).

Please remember it is an extremely long day for a child who is sent to school ill. Remaining at home will help minimize the spread of the infections and viruses in the classroom.
