Asking and answering questions before, during and after reading are key to truly understand the books we read. Story elements such as characters, setting, problem, and solution are great topics to discuss while your scholar is reading.
- **Sight Words:** Sight words are a key part of developing reading fluency and comprehension. Please practice sight words over the summer to build your scholars sight word knowledge. Using flash cards, youtube videos, or playing memory are great ways to practice sight words.
- **Making Math Matter:** Addition and subtraction fact knowledge are critical skills in promoting fluency in math. Please practice addition and subtraction facts frequently by using flash cards or the attached rocket math fact sheets.
