


✓ Identify and express his/her feelings when frustrated, confused, intimidated, worried, or disappointed


√ Have good body posture when listening, face the speaker

Consequences for non-compliance

Students will be held accountable for their behaviors. It is our school's policy to ensure that all students know what the behavior expectations are, reinforce those expectations, help students rehearse them and correct non-compliant behaviors. Depending on the frequency and severity of non-compliant behaviors students may experience consequences.

Social Consequences of Unexpected Behavior:

It is also our job to teach students that their behavior affects others around them. Students need to be socially mindful that others are watching their behaviors and formulating feelings and thoughts about them based on their behaviors. When students are non-compliant it makes other students feel:
