## 1. Principal Reports - SBAC Results/Report

Elementary Principals: Karl Edie, Sean Langdon

Board Goal #1:

Reviewed SBAC (smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium) results from last year for each school.

Jerry Yorgesen asked about a comparison to the state. Karl Edie responded that the state also did poorly but both of our schools (Morris Schott and Saddle Mt.) performed a little lower than the state.

5th grade seemed to be bright spots in both schools. This could be cohort related or teacher related.

Set goals of 5% increase. We have interim assessments this year to help us target the skills they need. This test asks them to be adaptable.

Board Goal #2 -Language: We did fairly well. Shared results.

#### JH Presentation, Andy Harlow:

Shared scores. Bright spot in 7th and 8th grade English/Language Arts. 6th grade is by far our lowest cohort. Our schedule was difficult last year and we have worked with Esmeralda on creating a better one for this year. In 8th grade math we outperformed the last two years which is a testament to the teachers and students.

WELPA (Washington English Language Proficiency Assessment) - Shining thing for us. Second year in a row we have beat the state in percent transitioning each grade. This is a testament to everything that we are doing. Lorraine Jenne asked for an explanation of AMAO. (Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives)

High School, Mia Benjamin; Shared results of SBAC and WELPA. HS is seeing more students in level 3 instead of level 2. Mentioned ESD training for common core and ELA alignment. This year we will have after school intervention for math, science and language arts with Gear Up.

Alice Jaakola is one of few who received a tech grant - Edu-Curious- for ELA.

Described the work at the staff retreat to focus on climate and culture. Greg Benner was asked to present there from UW.

Teachers are excited about coming together and tackling school-wide topics.

The investment of sending staff to Safe and Civil Schools is helping.


