News and Information

The events across our nation in the last couple weeks, the continuation of racist violence -- from individuals, from our institutions, and from our social and economic systems -- are being met with widespread demand for change. As principal of Lagunitas, I want to explicitly state and confirm that we all, every single one of

us, are committed to providing an education where racial equity and anti-bias viewpoints are taught, supported, and explored in a dynamic manner as we develop new approaches. We are committed to our own learning and growth as a team of educators. We aspire to raise students who think critically, who respect the common humanity in all, and who speak up and stand up when they see injustice and intolerance.

Schools have such an important role in our society. We educators have immense power with our access to children and families, and our charge to teach and influence. This is an honor and a serious responsibility. Equity is a standing agenda item for our monthly staff meetings and I propose we put this broad topic on more of our meeting agendas. We have found that the open-ended nature of the topic allows for unexpected discussion and is a reminder to approach decisions and practices with inclusive perspectives. We also welcome participation on the Equity Committee – a partnership between the school, the SGV Community Center, and our local community.

We need to look with a critical eye at ourselves and recognize where we can do better. It is heartening to hear that our state Superintendent of Public Instruction, Tony Thurmond, has vowed to address racism and implicit bias in education. He spoke on Monday of “how education can teach empathy and tolerance and build racial justice.” (See original article [here](#).) Resources will be provided on the state website and I will share resources I’ve received already from the county office and local organizations to support our children.

Graduation Plans

Our graduation plans are underway! Our **8th grade graduation** ceremony is on Wednesday, June 10 at 1 pm. Families should approach the school from the east, in front of the Community Center. We will have traffic patrols out on the street and at the entrance to the school. Cars will pull up to our staging area by the entrance to the lower campus MPR. Students will get out of cars with masks on, one at a time, walk the red carpet and receive their diplomas. We will have live music and teachers will present the students with their individual recognition statements. These are always a heart-warming part of our Lagunitas graduations. We will video the event. A family member may take a photo of their child graduating. Let’s have fun with the event and celebrate our wonderful students as they end their first 9 years of school!

Our **5th grade Montessori graduation** is on Thursday, June 11 at 3 pm. Alex has created an event on Zoom that includes much of the traditional flourishes the students look forward to each year. Students select a family member or friend who gives a personal speech in their honor. The 4th graders also participate and there will be other speeches. At 4 pm, families will gather in cars at the WIC, then parade through Woodacre to Lagunitas School in decorated cars with songs the children select. In the main parking lot by the gym, cars will create a circle and students will toss caps and cheer one another from afar.

Our **5th and 6th grade Open Classroom graduation** is on Tuesday, June 9 at 9:30 am on Zoom. Like the traditional Open Classroom graduation, students will say a few words then hear from family and classmates. 4th graders make secret futures posters for the graduates that will be unveiled during the ceremony. In the

afternoon, at 2 pm, families will meet in cars on the San Geronimo campus for a final hoorah send-off from a safe distance.

Our **Montessori kindergarten graduation** is on Thursday, June 11 at 10 am on Zoom. First graders will share their appreciations of the kindergarteners and there will be a sweet ceremony.

Our **Open Classroom kindergarten graduation** is on Thursday, June 11 at 10 am on Zoom. The traditional unique ceremony will start with kindergarten, then be open to the other classes.
