2.2.2.1 Description of Coordination of Services for American Indian/Alaska Native Students

The Tutoring program is geared towards assisting students in their academics and state mandated tests. Native students are able to enroll in accrual credit, credit recovery or summer classes for no charge since the project assists with paying for a virtual provider. We offer Native American history/studies for MS students. There will be a Youth Development Specialist. The focus of the Youth Specialist will be to guide students in college and career choices and help monitor students' academic progress. Also, the specialist will collaborate with the Ind Ed coordinator to plan monthly family meetings centered on cultural activities, cultural academic enrichment, and college and career info. In addition, there may be other cultural events or activities the specialist may be involved with throughout the school year. Examples of the activities could be in the form of attending our local Indian Health Resource Center that hosts monthly Native Nations Youth Council meetings, field trips and other functions or events. Further, the Specialist and Clerk will assist in keeping track of inventory, supplies and other clerical duties that arise through-out the year. We will consult and collaborate quarterly or as needed with Muscogee Creek Nation during the 20-21 school year.

Muscogee Creek Nation discussed the tribe's plan to improve academic success, assist in helping engage community members and develop a partnership between the tribe and schools. The Ind. Ed Coordinator/Tina Francis meet in person with Jackie White 3 times during the school year. Topics discussed during the meetings were Title VI grant, monies expenditure, Parent-Teacher Committee By-laws, Parent meetings and cultural activities. Furthermore, Tina Francis and Jackie White exchanged numerous emails and spoke several times on the phone discussing Title VI grant info. Based upon the dialogue between Muscogee Creek Nation and Bixby Schools, the Parent-Committee By-Laws were revised and approved during the March 9th Parent-Committee meeting.
