Erosion Prevention Cost-Share Initiative

OVERVIEW

The Broadmoor Lake is an asset to the Broadmoor neighborhood, but the land erosion around the perimeter of the lake is becoming a liability. An easement exists to allow open and safe access to the lake for the benefit of residents within the Broadmoor neighborhood. However, the board understands this can seem to be cost-prohibitive, so it has introduced an initiative designed to split the cost of retaining wall construction along the lakefront.

GOALS

- 1. Encourage homeowners to take proactive steps towards safeguarding Broadmoor Lake for the benefit of all.
- 2. Provide a unified appearance to retaining walls along Broadmoor Lake.
- 3. Test the efficacy of the program and, if desirable, research other ways in which such a program could be applied to critical community needs along non-lakefront properties.

SPECIFICATIONS

The Broadmoor Recreation Area Improvement District will match 1:1 funds up to \$500 for one household per quarter, beginning 1 April 2019, for the purpose of constructing a concrete retaining wall of one of two styles:

1. A stacked bag concrete retaining wall, as seen in the examples below:





2. A professionally-installed, contractor-built concrete retaining wall, as seen in the example below:



How does it Work?

Each quarter, one household will be selected from among those who completed this application. When a household received notification of acceptance into the program, they are then authorized to purchase materials and complete the work.

Once completed, they will provide receipts for materials/contractor and proof of work *before the end of the quarter* in order to qualify for the 1:1 Funds Match (of up to \$500). This will be paid to the person who was named in the application via check.

If all funds are not used, they will be returned to the program fund.

If a wall costs \$600 to build, the program will match the household's contribution of \$300 and return \$200 to the program fund.

If a wall costs \$900 to build, the program will match the household's contribution of \$450 and return \$50 to the program fund.

If a wall costs \$1,200 to build, the program will match the household's contribution up to \$500, and return \$0 to the program fund.
