


ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT




ACT Aspire 3rd Grade Proficiency Scores




ACT Aspire 4th Grade Proficiency Scores









ACT Aspire 5th Grade Proficiency Scores







ACT Aspire 8th Grade Proficiency Scores




