Executive Summary

I conducted an open dump complaint inspection at the Blue Ridge School District #18 bus facility on March 31, 2020. The inspection found evidence of spillage of diesel fuel from on-site fuel tanks that had not been promptly remediated. Open dumping violations were cited in an April 8, 2020 ACWN. The School District hired a contractor that performed drilling and sampling activities at the site. The samples all met TACO Tier 1 objectives. The violations have been resolved.

Inspection Narrative

On May 8, 2020, Blue Ridge School District submitted a subsurface sampling report and cover letter addressing the April 8, 2020 ACWN sent for an apparent unreported diesel fuel release. I reviewed the submittal on May 15, 2020. The District hired Bodine Environmental, which conducted six borings to a depth of 12 feet. A sample was collected from each boring for analysis. All the sample results (attached) indicated constituents were below TACO Tier 1 levels.

No further action is needed at the site and all apparent violations have been resolved.
