Time for a summer time bingo party.

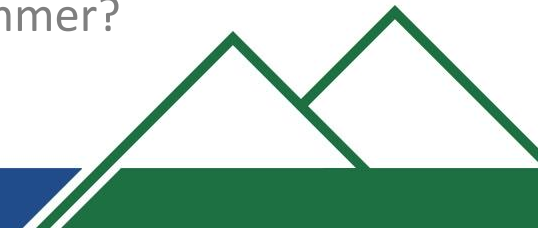
Take a look at the monthly activities. You can complete them in any order.

<p>Get out the scissors and cut out different shapes - circle, square, triangle.</p> 	<p>Write your name then write all the uppercase letters in the alphabet.</p>	<p>Help cook today. Have a pajama party. Write what's fun in your journal.

Count to 20 five different times today.
