RESOLUTION authorizing the issuance of General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) of Community High School District Number 117, Lake County, Illinois, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 pursuant to the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, for the purpose of building and equipping a District fieldhouse addition to the Lakes Community High School Building.

\* \* \*

WHEREAS, Community High School District Number 117, Lake County, Illinois (the "*District*"), is a duly organized and existing school district created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of the School Code of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "*School Code*"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District (the "*Board*"), has considered the existing school facilities and the improvements and extensions necessary to be made thereto in order that the same will adequately serve the educational needs of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the District to build and equip a District fieldhouse addition to the Lakes Community High School Building (the "*Project*"), all in accordance with the preliminary estimate of cost heretofore approved by the Board and now on file in the office of the Secretary of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board has further determined the estimated cost of the Project, including legal, financial, bond discount, capitalized interest, printing and publication costs and other expenses, to be not less than \$7,000,000, and there are insufficient funds on hand and lawfully available to pay such costs; and

WHEREAS, the Board has further determined that it is advisable and necessary that the Project be undertaken and, in order to raise the funds required to pay such cost, that the District borrow the sum of \$7,000,000 and, in evidence thereof, issue General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) in an aggregate principal amount of \$7,000,000 (the "*Bonds*"), in



accordance with the provisions of Section 15 of the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable from taxes, grants, amounts distributed to the District pursuant to Section 18-8.15 of the School Code, or substitute distributions therefor as provided by the State of Illinois in the future, interest earnings and other revenues received by the District and available to be expended for the improvement, maintenance, repair and benefit of school buildings and property (the "*Pledged Revenues*"); and

WHEREAS, if the Pledged Revenues are insufficient to pay the Bonds, ad valorem property taxes upon all taxable property in the District without limitation as to rate or amount are authorized to be extended to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Education of Community High School District Number 117, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

*Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles.* The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by this reference.

*Section 2. Determination to Issue Bonds.* It is necessary and in the best interests of the District to undertake the Project and the Bonds are hereby authorized to be issued and sold for that purpose.

*Section 3. Publication.* This Resolution, together with a notice in the statutory form, shall be published in the *Daily Herald*, the same being a newspaper of general circulation in the District, and if no petition, signed by 2,457 electors, the same being equal to the greater of (i) 7.5% of the number of registered voters in the District or (ii) 200 of those registered voters or 15% of those registered voters, whichever is less, asking that the issuance of the Bonds be submitted to

referendum, is filed with the Secretary of the Board within thirty (30) days after the date of the publication of this Resolution and said notice, then the Bonds shall be authorized to be issued.


*Section 4. Additional Resolutions.* If no petition meeting the requirements of applicable law is filed during the petition period hereinabove referred to, then the Board may adopt additional resolutions or proceedings supplementing or amending this Resolution providing for the issuance and sale of the Bonds and prescribing all the details of the Bonds, so long as the maximum amount of the Bonds as set forth in this Resolution is not exceeded and there is no material change in the Project or the purposes described herein. Such additional resolutions or proceedings shall in all instances become effective immediately without publication or posting or any further act or requirement. This Resolution, together with such additional resolutions or proceedings, shall constitute complete authority for the issuance of the Bonds under applicable law.

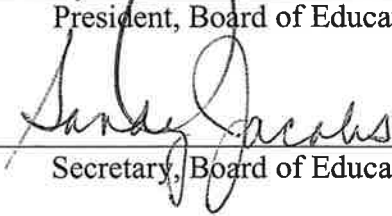
*Section 5. Severability.* If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Resolution.

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*Section 6. Repealer.* All resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, and that this Resolution be in full force and effect forthwith upon its adoption.

RESOLUTION calling a public hearing concerning the intent of the Board of Education of Community High School District Number 117, Lake County, Illinois, to sell \$7,000,000 General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) for the purpose of building and equipping a District fieldhouse addition to the Lakes Community High School Building.

\* \* \*

WHEREAS, Community High School District Number 117, Lake County, Illinois (the “*District*”), is a duly organized and existing school district created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of the School Code of the State of Illinois, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, including the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District (the “*Board*”) intends to sell bonds in the amount of \$7,000,000 for the purpose of building and equipping a District fieldhouse addition to the Lakes Community High School Building (the “*Bonds*”); and

WHEREAS, the Bond Issue Notification Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, requires the Board to hold a public hearing concerning the Board’s intent to sell the Bonds before adopting a resolution providing for the sale of the Bonds:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It and It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Education of Community High School District Number 117, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

*Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles.* The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by reference.

*Section 2. Public Hearing.* The Board hereby calls a public hearing to be held at 6:30 o’clock P.M. on the 20th day of June, 2019, at the Antioch Community High School, 1133 Main Street, Antioch, Illinois, in the District, concerning the Board’s intent to sell the Bonds and to receive public comments regarding the proposal to sell the Bonds (the “*Hearing*”).

*Section 3. Notice.* The Secretary of the Board (the “*Secretary*”) shall (i) publish notice of the Hearing at least once in the *Daily Herald*, the same being a newspaper of general circulation in the District, not less than 7 nor more than 30 days before the date of the Hearing and (ii) post at least 48 hours before the Hearing a copy of said notice at the principal office of the Board, which notice will be continuously available for public review during the entire 48-hour period preceding the Hearing.

*Section 4. Form of Notice.* Notice of the Hearing shall appear above the name of the Secretary and shall be in substantially the following form:

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING CONCERNING THE INTENT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF  
COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER 117, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS TO  
SELL \$7,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BONDS (ALTERNATE REVENUE SOURCE)**

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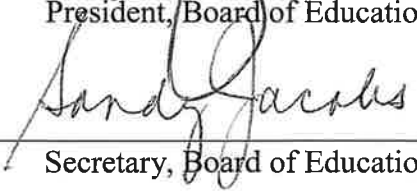
