Field Testing Resolution

1 – Mr. Fortun 2 – Ms. McCarthy

The Board of Education approves, upon the recommendation of the Brittonkill Curriculum and Assessment Council, the following:

WHEREAS, the New York State Education Department has brought before the New York Board of Regents a proposal to amend Sections 100.2, 100.3 and 100.4 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education relating to school participation in NYS Field Tests, to take effect on February 25, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Commissioner's Regulations would make explicit the requirement that public schools participate in stand-alone field tests on a mandatory basis; and

WHEREAS, NYS standardized tests currently have approximately 25% field test questions already embedded in the NINE hours of testing each year for grades three through eight and stand-alone field tests are undertaken by schools on a voluntary basis; and

WHEREAS, students are already tested at unprecedented levels due to recent changes to the state's APPR process, requiring growing amounts of time, money, and energy on high-stakes standardized testing, in which student performance on standardized tests is used to make major decisions affecting individual students, educators and schools; and

WHEREAS, Pearson Education Company has a five year, \$32 million contract with New York State to provide testing and should be responsible for incurring the costs associated with fulfilling its end of the contract; and

WHEREAS, Pearson Education Company is currently using students as free labor to reduce these costs and school children should not bear the burden of research and development for test publishers which are private, for-profit corporations; and

WHEREAS, the School Board is strongly opposed to stand alone field testing because it will not improve education, it cuts into the precious instructional time of students and staff, it does not contribute to critical, reflective and creative thinking or to developing students as 21st century learners, and it does not inform instruction; and

WHEREAS, in 2012 NYSSBA adopted a resolution in opposition to stand-alone field testing calling upon "members of our State Legislature and the State Education Department to seek legislation and regulatory practices that will take immediate action to eliminate mandated stand-alone field testing practices in New York State;"

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that The Brittonkill School Board states its commitment as an advocate for students and calls upon the Commissioner of Education, the Board of Regents, the New York State Legislature and the Governor to reject the amendments to Sections 100.2, 100.3 and 100.4 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education relating to school participation in NYS Field Tests, to take effect on February 25, 2015

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Brittonkill Board of Education calls on the Commissioner of Education, the Board of Regents, the New York State Legislature and the Governor to eliminate stand-alone field testing, on the whole as it largely benefits commercial enterprise, rather than the educational enterprise, negatively impacts students, and wastes instructional time.

Collins-Scoville

The Board of Education approves the attached agreement between Collins-Scoville Architecture/Engineering/Construction Management (d/b/a CSArch Architecture/Engineering/Construction Management) and the Brunswick Central School District for the purpose of preparing a Building Condition Survey (BCS) and Five Year Capital Facilities Plan as required by the NYS Education Department. Upon completion of the BCS, the Architect will work with the district to develop a Five Year Capital facilities Plan and project scope leading to a public bond referendum in November or December 2015. The project budget will be determined during the pre-referendum phase. The Board of Education also authorizes the Board President to sign the agreement on behalf of the district. This agreement is in accordance with Proposal for Building Condition Survey, Five Year Capital Facilities Plan & Capital Construction Project submitted by CS Arch and approved by the Board at their October 16, 2014 board meeting.
