COMMON ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Each program listed requires the recipient to:

- be a Kansas resident
- enroll in a qualified program in a **Kansas** college or university and
- not already awarded an undergraduate degree, unless you are applying for the Kansas Nursing or Kansas Teacher Service Scholarships. See program description section for details.

Remember: Use the correct student social security number on both the federal (FAFSA) and State of Kansas Student Aid Applications.

USE OF FEDERAL APPLICATION (FAFSA)

Many FAFSA questions are used to determine eligibility for the State of Kansas programs, complete the FAFSA carefully and accurately. Otherwise, your scholarship application may be rejected. You may estimate adjusted gross income and federal taxes paid in order to meet application priority deadlines. **Do not send** your FAFSA to the Kansas Board of Regents!

KANSAS CAREER TECHNICAL WORKFORCE GRANT

The purpose of this grant program is to encourage individuals to further their education and provide the benefit of their employment to the State of Kansas to assist in the development of a strong state workforce in high demand, critical industry employment fields.

Grants are awarded to students who are Kansas residents and:

1. have graduated from a high school accredited by the State Board of Education **or**
2. have received general educational development (GED) credentials issued by the Kansas Board of Regents, **or**
3. have graduated from a home school program or a non-accredited private secondary school as defined and authorized pursuant to K.S.A. 72-53, 100 et.seq.

Students must be enrolled in or have been accepted for admission to an eligible career technical education program operated by a designated Kansas educational institution that has been identified as offering a technical certificate or associate of applied science degree program in a high cost, high demand and critical industry field. Designated Kansas educational institutions include technical colleges, community colleges, and public four-year colleges that award associate of applied science degrees; and Washburn Institute of Technology. Only technical certificate and associate of applied science degree programs are included among the eligible programs. Students may be enrolled either part-time or full-time in their program of study.

Criteria used in selecting recipients includes: Kansas resident status and admission or enrollment in a designated high demand, critical industry program of study at a designated Kansas educational institution. Preference is given to applicants with financial need as measured by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- ❖ **All applicants must have an official at their postsecondary institution complete the Career Technical Workforce Grant Verification Form (page 17).**

Award Amount

- The maximum amount of the award is \$1,000 per year for full-time students.
For students in 7-11 hours the award would be \$800 per year
For students in 3-6 hours the award would be \$500 per year
- Awards for part-time students are pro-rated based on the number of hours enrolled.
- Funding for the program is subject to the availability of resources.
- The priority deadline for applications is May 1st each year.

Awards are renewable contingent upon the recipient maintaining:

- a) satisfactory academic progress;
- b) continuous enrollment in a high demand, critical industry field;
- c) submission of a renewal grant application; and
- d) the availability of funding.

Priority Deadline: May 1

KANSAS ETHNIC MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship applicants must complete the State of Kansas Student Aid Application **and new applicants** must have their high school counselor, registrar or similar official complete the Ethnic Minority Scholarship Information Form. All applicants must complete the FAFSA. Funding priority goes to eligible renewals and freshman. **Awards are based on financial need.**

The **Kansas Ethnic Minority Scholarship** is designed to assist financially needy, academically competitive students who are identified as members of any of the following ethnic/racial groups: African American, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Asian or Pacific Islander, or Hispanic. Selection priority is given to applicants who will graduate from high school in 2014 and have completed one of the academic requirements below.

The minimum academic requirements for eligibility include **one** of the following:

- 1) ACT score of 21 or SAT of 990; or
- 2) Cumulative high school GPA of 3.00; or
- 3) High school rank in upper 33%; or
- 4) Completion of Kansas Scholars Curriculum; or
- 5) Selection by National Merit Corporation in any category; or
- 6) Selection by College Board as a Hispanic Scholar.

Students who meet **one** of the minimum requirements comprise the applicant pool and **selection is competitive, based on relative academic strength.** Undergraduates may receive funds for four years (five years if enrolled in a designated five-year program). Recipients must attend a Kansas community college or a four-year private or public college or university and be enrolled in 12 credit hours or more.

- ❖ **All NEW applicants** must have a high school official complete the Ethnic Minority Scholarship Information Form. (see page 19)

Ethnic Minority scholarship recipients may receive up to \$1,850 annually based on financial need as measured by Federal Methodology using data submitted on the FAFSA **and** availability of state funds.

Renewals are students who received this scholarship the prior year; the student must complete/submit the FAFSA and the State of Kansas Student Aid Application for each year of funding.

To be eligible for funding, you must:

- be enrolled full-time;
- maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA; and
- have financial need.

Deadline to apply for the Kansas Ethnic Minority Scholarship is May 1, 2014.

KANSAS MILITARY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

Candidates who served in any military operation after 9/11/2001 for which they received hostile fire pay are eligible to complete and submit the State of Kansas Student Aid Application along with a copy of their DD-214 form or active duty orders.

Program Description

Available for the payment of tuition and fees at Kansas public postsecondary institutions for students who are a resident of Kansas and:

- Has served after September 11, 2001, in military service in international waters or on foreign soil in support of military operations for at least 90 days or less than 90 days because of injuries received during such military service;
- Has received an honorable discharge or under honorable conditions (general) discharge from military service or is still in military service and;
- Has a DD-214 form or active duty orders, whichever such paper or order indicate the location of the person's deployment and indicate the person has served after September 11, 2001, in any military operation for which they received hostile fire pay.

Because financial need is a priority in awarding this scholarship, students must file a FAFSA. Priority in awarding scholarships is given to those students with the greatest financial need. Once your institution considers you as a graduate student, you are not eligible for this scholarship.

Students may enroll at any of the following Kansas public postsecondary institutions: the six state universities, Washburn University, community colleges and technical colleges.

Requirements for Eligible Students

Recipients of the scholarship:

- ✓ shall remain in good academic standing at the Kansas educational institution where they are enrolled;
- ✓ shall make satisfactory progress toward completion of the requirements of the educational program in which they are enrolled;
- ✓ can be part-time or full-time, but must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 hours each semester;
- ✓ are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and have the FAFSA submitted to the institution they are attending; and
- ✓ must submit the State of Kansas Student Aid Application and DD214 to the Kansas Board of Regents.

Any federal military tuition assistance that the student receives will be applied first toward the student's tuition/fees and only the remaining balance will be eligible for scholarship assistance. Eligible students may be awarded a scholarship for not more than four academic years of undergraduate study (five years if enrolled in a designated five-year program). If a student is not enrolled on a full-time basis, a student shall complete the course of study within a reasonable time period based upon the number of hours enrolled in an academic period and computed as a fraction of the total number of credit hours required for full-time enrollment. Continued funding for this scholarship is subject to state appropriations.

Priority Deadline: May 1

***Applications will be processed in order of application date
and greatest financial need until all funding is awarded.***

KANSAS NATIONAL GUARD EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

This assistance program is available to students enrolled full-time or part-time at accredited independent colleges and universities located in Kansas and Kansas public postsecondary institutions: the six state universities, Washburn University, community colleges and technical colleges.

Program Description

This program provides a percentage of tuition and fees paid; up to a maximum rate not to exceed the maximum rate that would be charged by the state educational institutions for enrollment and that percentage is determined by the number of eligible students and available appropriations. Students may be pursuing a certificate, diploma or degree program and must be current members of a Kansas Air/Army National Guard unit. Full-time enrollment is not required.

Recipients must also agree to complete their current service obligation to the Kansas Air/Army National Guard, plus three months service for each semester of Kansas National Guard Educational assistance received.

Requirements for Eligible Students

Eligible guard members include:

- non-commissioned officers who have less than 20 years of service;
 - are enlisted in the Kansas National Guard;
 - student must have a GED or high school diploma;
 - enrolled in a Kansas educational institution; and
 - not already have obtained a bachelor's degree.
- ❖ The guard member must agree to complete their current service obligation to the Kansas Air/Army National Guard plus three months of service for each semester of assistance received.
 - ❖ The guard member must have his/her unit commander complete and sign the KBOR 6006-A Form and the form must be returned to KBOR, 1000 SW Jackson St, Ste 520, Topeka, KS 66612.

Recipients of the scholarship:

- ✓ shall remain in good standing at the Kansas educational institution where they are enrolled;
- ✓ make satisfactory progress toward completion of the requirements of the educational program in which enrolled; and
- ✓ maintain satisfactory participation in the Kansas National Guard.

Applications are processed in order of application date. Priority Deadline May 1

Award Amount

The award amount is subject to a number of factors including the:

- funds available;
 - number of eligible applicants; and
 - the student's federal tuition assistance.
- ❖ **If a recipient is unable to fulfill the service obligation they will be responsible for repaying the Kansas Board of Regents the amount of the scholarship that they received.**

KANSAS NURSING SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

The Kansas Nursing Service Scholarship is designed to encourage enrollment in nursing programs by Kansans committed to practicing as a LPN or RN in Kansas. Recipients sign an agreement/promissory note with the State of Kansas to practice nursing at a specific facility one year for each year of scholarship support. The sponsor provides partial scholarship funding and employment upon licensure of the recipient and the State of Kansas funds the balance. All applicants must complete the FAFSA.

The Kansas Nursing Service Scholarship minimum application criterion includes:

1. Acceptance to a Kansas nursing program (pre-nursing will not be funded);
2. Commitment by an eligible sponsor* licensed by the state to fund up to half of the scholarship and provide full-time employment to the recipient after licensure;
3. Complete/submit the FAFSA and the State of Kansas Student Aid Application; and
4. Student must be enrolled in 12 credit hours or more.

Financial need is considered if there are more applicants than available funding.

The Kansas Nursing Service Scholarship accepts applicants with degrees, but who **have not** received Registered Nurse licensure.

*An eligible sponsor is any adult care home, psychiatric hospital, medical care facility, home health agency, local health department or any state agency, which employs LPNs or RNs, licensed by the State of Kansas qualifies as a sponsor.

Kansas Nursing Service Scholarship recipients who are enrolled in:

- a Licensed Practical Nurse program are eligible for **\$2,500** each school year **or**
- a Registered Nurse program are eligible for **\$3,500** each school year.

Sponsors pay from \$1,000 to one-half of the scholarship and the State of Kansas pays the remaining amount. Each scholarship amount is divided — one half awarded in the fall semester (LPN \$1,250; RN \$1,750) and the second half awarded in the spring semester.

Renewals are students who received this scholarship the prior year; the student must complete/submit the FAFSA, the State of Kansas Student Aid Application, and a copy of a signed sponsor agreement **each school year** to receive funding.

RECIPIENT OBLIGATION:

Scholarship recipients work for the sponsor, who provided a portion of the funds, one year for each year of scholarship support.

- ❖ If a recipient is unable to fulfill the service obligation to the state they will be subject to repaying the state portion of the scholarship they received plus accrued interest at a rate which is equivalent to the interest rate applicable to loans made under the federal PLUS program at the time the agreement was first entered into plus five percentage points (currently that interest rate is 11.41%).

- ❖ New recipients must sign an agreement/promissory note.

KANSAS STATE SCHOLARSHIP

To be eligible to apply for the Kansas State Scholarship, in the senior year of a Kansas high school you would have:

- 1) received a certificate stating that you completed the required curriculum **AND**
- 2) received a letter stating that you were **designated** by the Kansas Board of Regents.

Designation is based on an index, which mathematically combines the ACT composite score and GPA. All applicants must complete the FAFSA and State of Kansas Student Aid Application each year, funding priority goes to renewals. The number of designees is dependent on state funding levels.

Awards are based on financial need and/or other financial awards received.

*****It is the responsibility of the State Scholar
to reapply for funding each school year on or before May 1. *****

The Kansas State Scholarship program is designed to assist financially needy students in the top 20-40% of Kansas high school graduates who are designated as a State Scholar.

Minimum requirements include:

- 1) Take the ACT Assessment by December of the senior year;
- 2) Complete the Kansas Scholars Curriculum;
- 3) KSC curriculum and 7th semester GPA certified on the official roster by the high school counselor, registrar, or similar official and;
- 4) Graduate during the 2013-2014 academic year.

The academic profile of 2013 designated scholars included an average ACT of 30 and an average GPA of 3.90.

Award Amount

Designated State Scholars may receive up to \$1,000 annually based on financial need as measured by the Federal Methodology using data submitted on the FAFSA **and** the availability of state funds.

Funding priority goes to upper-class students (those graduating from high school before 2014). Scholars may receive funds for four undergraduate years (five years if enrolled in a designated five-year program).

Scholars who are not financially eligible for funding this year may be eligible in a following year and should apply for aid **each school year** to officially learn of eligibility.

Scholars must be enrolled in 12 credit hours or more and maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA and have financial need to be eligible for funding. Renewals are **not** notified.

- State of Kansas Student Aid Application completed and submitted either online at www.kansasregents.org or pages 13 - 15 of the paper version and the \$12.00 non-refundable application fee submitted. (Priority deadline May 1)

KANSAS TEACHER SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

This service obligation scholarship program provides financial assistance to both students pursuing bachelor's degree programs and currently licensed teachers pursuing endorsement in hard-to-fill disciplines or master's degrees in hard-to-fill disciplines or either group planning to teach (K-12) in an underserved geographic area in Kansas. Applicants must complete the FAFSA.

The Kansas Teacher Service Scholarship was enacted to support the need for licensed and fully endorsed teachers in the hard-to-fill disciplines and underserved geographic areas in the State of Kansas.

Applicants must be: a resident of the State of Kansas and attending a Kansas postsecondary institution; **AND**

- a.) Enrolled in a program leading to licensure as a teacher in an identified discipline* or underserved area** (Accepted for admission, or currently enrolled, in a course of instruction leading to licensure as a teacher in one of the hard-to-fill disciplines* or one of the underserved geographic areas** of Kansas);
OR
- b.) Currently licensed as a teacher enrolled in a course of instruction leading to endorsement in one of the hard-to-fill disciplines* or teach in one of the underserved geographic areas** in Kansas;
OR
- c.) Currently licensed teachers enrolled in a program leading to a master's degree in an identified discipline* or underserved area** (Currently licensed as a teacher and been accepted for admission, or enrolled in a course of instruction leading to a master's degree in a field of education as a teacher in one of the hard-to-fill disciplines*, or in one of the underserved geographic areas** of Kansas. This scholarship is not a resource for Counseling, Administration or Reading/Library Specialist degrees);
AND
- d.) Complete the FAFSA and the State of Kansas Student Aid Application.

***Identified Hard-to-fill disciplines for 2014-15 are:**

**Special Education, Mathematics, Science,
Foreign Language, English as a Second Language (ESL)**

****Underserved Geographic Areas are:**

**USD 501 Topeka; USD 500 Kansas City, KS;
USD 259 Wichita and State Board of Education Area 5 (which includes all of the
western 1/3 of the State of Kansas).**

RECIPIENTS:

First priority in awarding goes to junior and senior level college students and currently licensed teachers who meet the outlined criteria and provide all official academic transcripts and at least one academic, or employment-related letter of recommendation, and personal statement of your academic and teaching goal. Funds are rarely available for freshman or sophomore students. This is a merit-based scholarship. Students may be enrolled either part-time or full-time. The average GPA of recipients has been 3.50. The number of designees is dependent on state funding levels.

Renewals are prior year recipients, and must submit: the FAFSA and the State of Kansas Student Aid Application ***each school year*** to receive funding.

SERVICE OBLIGATION REQUIREMENT:

Kansas Teacher Service Scholarship recipients will sign **an agreement/promissory note with the State of Kansas** in which they will agree to:

- Complete the required course of instruction leading to licensure and full endorsement in a field of education as a teacher in the selected hard-to-fill teaching discipline or in an underserved geographic area in the State of Kansas;
- Obtain and maintain necessary licensure and endorsement as specified in the teaching agreement;
- Engage in teaching in the hard-to-fill discipline or in an underserved geographic area in the State of Kansas, within six months of licensure, in an accredited public or private elementary or secondary school on a full-time basis for a period equal to the time scholarship was awarded or commence teaching on a part-time basis for a period of time that is equivalent to full-time, multiplied by the length of the course of instruction for which the scholarship was awarded.

Please Note: Fulfillment of your teaching obligation begins **AFTER** completion of your program or you are no longer receiving the scholarship.

- ❖ If a recipient is unable to fulfill the service obligation they will be subject to repaying the amount of the scholarship they received plus accrued interest at a rate which is equivalent to the interest rate applicable to loans made under the federal PLUS program at the time the agreement was first entered into plus five percentage points (currently that interest rate is 11.41%).

KANSAS COMPREHENSIVE GRANT

The Kansas Comprehensive Grant is available to Kansas residents enrolled full-time at eighteen private colleges and universities located in Kansas, the six public universities, and Washburn University. To be considered you must complete and submit the FAFSA, the **FAFSA priority deadline is April 1**. The funding level allows about 1 in 3 eligible students to be assisted with award amounts ranging from \$200-\$3,500 at the private institutions and \$100-\$1,500 at the public institutions. The grant is based on financial need. The Kansas Comprehensive Grant is disbursed at the institution level with FAFSA information driving who are recipients and the award amounts. The State of Kansas Student Aid Application is not required for this grant.

KANSAS CAREER WORK STUDY

The Kansas Career Work Study program is available to eligible Kansas residents, enrolled at least half-time at the six public universities and Washburn University. Eligible students work on a part-time basis on behalf of an employer which complements and enhances the educational preparation of the student's career. Employers are any private business, not-for-profit organization, or public agency with a place of business in Kansas which will pay compensation to an eligible student for services performed on a part-time basis by an eligible student as directed and requested by the employer.

Recipients of this program must be "in need of earnings from employment". The total earnings of each eligible student participating in the program shall not exceed the total cost of attendance at an eligible institution, or the amount of established financial need on the part of the eligible student, whichever is less. For more information regarding eligibility and application procedures contact the student financial aid offices at the six state universities and Washburn University.

KANSAS ROTC SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

Student agrees to accept a commission as a Second Lieutenant and serve for not less than four years as a commissioned officer in the Kansas Army National Guard. This program is only available at Kansas State University, Pittsburg State University, University of Kansas and Washburn University. Contact the ROTC program at one of the participating schools for more information.

NURSE EDUCATOR SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship allocates funding to award graduate level nursing students who agree to teach in a nurse education program one year for each year of assistance. Applicants must complete an application available at the following institutions which are currently participating: Fort Hays State University, Pittsburg State University, University of Kansas Medical Center, Washburn University and Wichita State University.

KANSAS OSTEOPATHIC MEDICAL SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

Designed to encourage service in rural areas of Kansas. Recipients receive up to \$15,000 per year for up to four years of study at nationally accredited Osteopathic schools. Preference goes to first year students. Recipients serve one year of practice for each year of assistance. Applicants must complete an application and the FAFSA. Priority deadline: May 1. Application is available at www.kansasregents.org.

KANSAS OPTOMETRY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

Designed to encourage optometrists to establish a Kansas practice. Kansas helps pay the difference between resident and non-resident tuition at eligible out-of-state institutions. Generally, recipients must serve one year of practice for each year of assistance. Priority deadline: May 1. Application is available at www.kansasregents.org.

KANSAS DENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM

Designed to encourage dentists to establish a Kansas practice. Kansas helps pay the difference between resident and non-resident tuition at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. Applications are available from UM-KC. Deadline: Rolling.

JAMES B. PEARSON FELLOWSHIP

Established by former Kansas Senator James B. Pearson to encourage graduate students from Kansas public universities to experience the global perspective gained from study abroad. Preference is given to applicants whose studies are directly related to foreign affairs. Stipends average \$2,456. Applications are available from graduate school offices. Deadline: April 1.

KANSAS DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Created to encourage Brasenose, Chevening, Fulbright, Madison, Marshall, Mellon, Rhodes, and Truman scholars from Kansas to continue graduate studies at Kansas public universities. Kansas reimburses tuition and fees to recipients subject to funding constraints. Contact the Kansas Board of Regents for more information.
